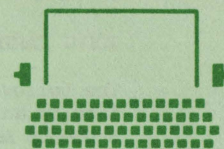

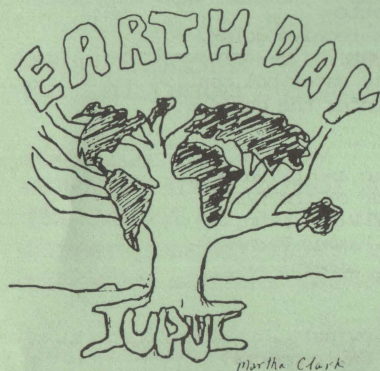

Indiana Governor Evan Bayh will deliver a major environmental speech at IUPUI Apr. 19 at 11 a.m. in the auditorium of University Place. Dean James Barnes from SPEA, IUB, under whose aegis the Governor is speaking, said, "I am particularly pleased that Governor Bayh thinks enough of the school and the University to deliver this speech at IUPUI." FOUR PACKED DAYS MARK FIRST ALL-CAMPUS EARTH DAY FEST IUPUI is

joining 100 million or so of the planet's people living in 133 countries who this year are celebrating the 20th anniversary of Earth Day. On campus April 16-19 children will plant wildflowers where they can watch them grow, adults will plant a "tree of life" and 1,200 tree seedlings will be given away for home planting. In a tent, in classrooms and in public forums, the ethical, environmental, economic and political import of preserving the earth's delicate ecosystems will be discussed and pondered. An American Indian, a Brazilian diplomat, faculty,

media professionals, politicians and business people will be among the speakers. Music, sufi dance, art and even "goofy olympic games" will enliven the celebration, the first of its kind on campus.

A big tent with exhibits and handouts from environmental groups will be up on Library Mall Wednesday and Thursday and will include the environmental art work of Gerald Bates.

Tuesday-Thursday from 10 a.m.-3 p.m. on the Library Mall the Indianapolis Department of Public Works will perform free auto emissions and tire pressure testing and will air up any low tires.

There is no charge for any event or seminar and everyone is welcome and urged to join in the celebration.
