The announcements will describe opportunities for funding by the nine award mechanisms (Health Disparity Research Award, Health Disparity Training Award, Clinical Consortium Award, Clinical Trial Award, Laboratory - Clinical Transition: Stage 1 Award, Idea Development Award, Synergistic Idea Development Award, New Investigator Award, Collaborative Undergraduate Historically Black Colleges and Universities Student Summer Training Program Award, Physician Research Training Award, and Prostate Cancer Training Award). DID YOU KNOW?

CAMPUS FACTS

For the year-to-date, IUPUI awards are up 29%. The number of proposals submitted is up 16% and the dollars requested are up 36%.

For fiscal year 2006, funding rate for proposals submitted to NIH from medical schools was 20.9%. For information on how this rate varies by department go to: http://grants.nih.gov/grants/award/success/meddept06.xls. The National Endowment for the Humanities and the National Science Foundation give the funding rate as 20% but note a wide disparity between programs. The

Department of Defense data is not available. For competitive programs in the Department of Agriculture, the funding rate is 10%.

IDENTIFYING FUNDING OPPORTUNITIES

Several on-line search tools are available to IUPUI investigators who are interested in identifying funding opportunities in their areas of interest. Several are listed below:

Community of Science (COS): COS is a primary on-line search tool for identifying funding opportunities. To take advantage of this powerful tool, register at http://www.cos.com/login/join.shtml. Once you have completed the short registration process, you can personalize your search by selecting the option entitled "launch your workbench". You can access federal, local, corporate, foundation, nonprofit and other funding opportunities using key terms and save the results of up to 20 searches and have them delivered to you weekly via email.

National Institutes of Health (NIH) "NIH Guide": To take advantage of this search tool, register at http://grants.nih.gov/grants/guide/listserv.htm. It allows you to receive discipline specific funding opportunities that are delivered to you weekly via email.

National Science Foundation (NSF) "MyNSF": To take advantage of this search tool, register at http://www.nsf.gov/mynsf/. It allows you to receive discipline specific funding opportunities that are delivered to you weekly via email.

Federal Business Opportunities "FedBizOpps": FedBizOpps is the single government point-of-entry for Federal government procurement opportunities over \$25,000. To take advantage of this search tool, visit http://vsearch1.fbo.gov/servlet/SearchServlet. Opportunities found at this site include, but are not limited to, presolicitations and special notices for research and service contracts for specific projects and some national centers and surveys that would not be found in Grants.gov and may not be found in the Community of Science.

Limited Submission Funding Opportunities: Occasionally a funding agency places a limitation on the number of proposals that can be submitted from a campus or university system. NATIONAL INSTITUTES OF HEALTH

SHARED INSTRUMENTATION GRANT PROGRAM: National Center for Research Resources (NCRR) Shared Instrument Grant (SIG) program solicits applications from groups of NIH-supported investigators to purchase or upgrade commercially available instruments that cost at least \$100,000. The maximum award is \$500,000. Types of instruments supported include confocal and electron microscopes, biomedical imagers, mass spectrometers, DNA sequencers, biosensors, cell sorters, X-ray diffraction systems, and NMR spectrometers among others. BEHAVIORAL MECHANISMS IN THE TRANSITION TO HABITUAL ALCOHOL SEEKING AND DRINKING: Focus is on alcohol's effects upon neural substrates of learning and memory as they contribute to behavioral characteristics of alcohol dependence; and the role of implicit cognitive factors and their underlying neural substrates in the transition to impulsive and/or compulsive drinking and to relapse.
