## HARK! HARK!

About 150 experts in listening will converge on Indianapolis this week (March 7-11) for the 11th annual International Listening Association Convention hosted by the Department of Communication and Theater. Participants are coming from 30 states and a half-dozen foreign countries to attend the program at the Embassy Suites, says James R. East, charter member and local arrangements chairman. "We can teach reading, we can teach writing and it follows that we can teach listening, too," says East, associate dean of liberal arts who teaches a listening course at IUPUI.

With the convention theme, "Centering Listening in an Oral Culture," topics were designed for communicators, trainers, sales and business professionals, as well as educators. East says that the average American spends about 45 percent of awake time listening, 30 percent speaking, 16 percent reading and 9 percent writing.

## SUMMERTIME LEARNING

Faculty and staff members can enroll their children in the Young Scholars Program this summer at IUPUI. The program is designed to stimulate creative exploration in learning for gifted and talented youngsters. It is a concentrated two-weeks-on-campus program taught by university faculty and staff members. It is aimed at two levels: those entering grades 3-6 in the fall and those entering grades 7-10. #### "BERLIN AIRLIFT" EXHIBIT AT CONFERENCE CENTER

If you're over in the Conference Center, stop by the "Blockade and Airlift" exhibit in the lobby. In the early days of German "disunification," the Soviets blocked Allied entry to the city and the Allies launched what has been considered "the greatest rescue operation in history" from June 26, 1948 to May 12, 1949. Allied aircraft kept food and supplies coming to the city by flying into West Berlin at the rate of about one every 90 seconds. The exhibit, which is on display until March 24, has been provided by the consulate-general of the Federal Republic of Germany and is hosted by the Department of German Language and Literature.


