PHILANTHROPY CENTER SETS INAUGURAL

R ockefeller Foundation President Richard W. Lyman and other dignitaries will be here Monday (Nov. 23) during an open public colloquium to inaugurate the new IU Center on Philanthropy. An invitational lunch is also planned. The colloquium is at 10 a.m. in the University Conference Center; the lunch is at noon in the Lincoln Hotel. Lyman, who is former president of Stanford University, speaks during lunch.

Panelists for the colloquium will be John J. Schwartz, past president of the American Association of Fund Raising Counsel, Inc., and a consultant to the center, who will discuss "Current Trends in Philanthropy;" Virginia A. Hodgkinson, vice president for research of the Independent Sector and member of the center's research committee, who will discuss "Mapping the Information Needs for Philanthropy," and James R. Wood, chairman and professor of sociology at IUB and center's associate director of research presenting "The Impact of Religion and Philanthropy."

Moderator will be Eugene R. Tempel, vice president of the IU Foundation and chairman of the center's operations advisory committee. Howard G. Schaller, executive dean at IUPUI, directs the new center, which was established last April with a \$4 million grant from Lilly Endowment, Inc. It is a comprehensive interdisciplinary organization that will conduct research and provide teaching programs in resource development, fund raising management and the cultural aspects of philanthropy. It includes the Fund Raising School, based in San Rafael, Cal. Everyone is invited to the colloquium. There is no charge.

LAW STOPS SMOKING MOST PLACES IN SOME BUILDINGS

The Indiana smoking law requires that there be no smoking, except in designated areas, in classroom and licensed health facilities on this campus and in other state-owned buildings. The law says there can be no smoking in rooms, hallways, elevators or stairwells in these kinds of buildings. On campus, buildings that fall into those two categories will have designated smoking areas and someone in the building will be appointed to locate and mark the place, put up signs, take complaints and enforce the smoking law. Where there are problems enforcing the no-smoking law, the IUPUI police will be asked to assist, and may also be called for people repeatedly break the smoking law. Deans and directors have been asked to post the name of the person appointed as the no-smoking building coordinator. These people hope everyone on campus will cooperate.


