"...It is basic that we as citizens strongly supplement, if not replace, our present scheme of materialistic values by a rebirth of the true needs of human personality so that men and women, boys and girls come before machines." This statement by Dr. Shane MacCarthy, Executive Director of the President's Council of Youth Fitness in Washington, D.C., illustrates the basic philosophy of this morning's speaker.

Born in Cork City, Ireland, Dr. MacCarthy received his early education in Finbarr's College, Ireland, and received his A.B. and A.M. degrees from the Catholic University of America in Washington, D.C. His teaching experiences in the political and social sciences at Georgetown University, and the Southeastern University, Washington, D.C. have been combined with lecturing in all 50 states and Europe, and extensive experience in television and radio.

Dr. MacCarthy who has an active interest in Junior Achievement, will discuss in his speech today how the fitness of youth can affect and bolster J.A. throughout the country.
