Army to Name Hospital for Nurse Heroine



RUTH M. GARDINER

The army general hospital in Chicago will be named Gardiner General Hospital in honor of Second Lieutenant Ruth M. Gardiner, former Indianapolis nurse, according to word received by her sister, Mrs. Constance G. Smith, 25 North Arsenal avenue.

Lieutenant Gardiner, a member of the army nurse corps serving with the air forces, was killed July 27 in a plane crash near Naknet, Alaska, while on a mission to evacuate patients by air transport.

Announcement of the honor conferred on the former Indianapolis girl was made by Major General H. S. Aurand, commanding general of the 6th service command. The hospital was converted from the Chicago Beach hotel.

Lieutenant Gardiner, age twenty-nine, was born in Alberta, Canada, and came to the United States at age three. She attended Sacred Heart High School and was employed at St. Agnes Hospital, White Plains, N. Y.; St. Elizabeth Hospital, New York, and the Indiana University medical center, here, before entering the army nurse corps in January.

She was assigned to an air evacuation squad attached to the army air forces of the Alaska defense command, and was the first member of the corps serving with the air forces killed in the line of duty in this war.

Hoosier Heroes

Lt. Ruth Gardiner, Army Air Force Nurse, Dies in Service

THE SECOND army nurse from Indianapolis to give her life in service, 2d Lt. Ruth M. Gardiner of the army air force service command, died on July 27 while serving somewhere in the North American area.

Lt. Gardiner's sister and only survivor, Mrs. Constance G. Smith, 25 N. Arsenal ave., received the notification from the war department Friday.

Mrs. Mafelda Arney, a nurse at the veterans hospital here for nine years, became the first local woman to die in service when she was killed in a plane crash in Colorado this spring.

Requiem high mass was conducted for Lt. Gardiner at 8 a. m. today at Holy Cross Catholic church, of which she was a member.

* * *

THE 29-YEAR-OLD nurse enlisted in the army nurse corps in January at Stout field. Assigned to Bowman field, Ky., she left for overseas duty on April 23 from Seattle, Wash. From July, 1942, until her enlistment she had worked at the Indiana university medical center.

Born in Calgary, Alberta, Canada, Lt. Gardiner came to Indianapolis when she was three. She attended Holy Cross grade school and Sacred Heart high school and then took her nurse's training at Whitehaven sanatorium in Whitehaven, Pa. She was the first and only graduate of Whitehaven to enter the service.

Upon becoming a graduate nurse, Lt. Gardiner worked at the Whitehaven sanatorium, then in surgery at St. Elizabeth's hospital in New York city, and during the five years before she returned to

Local Nurse Killed In Line of Duty To Be Honored

Mrs. Constance G. Smith, 25 North Arsenal avenue, was notified yesterday that the Army General Hospital in Chicago will be named Gardiner General Hospital in honor of her sister, Second Lieutenant Ruth M. Gardiner, first member of the Army Nurse Corps serving with the Air Forces killed in line of duty in the war.

Lieut. Gardiner was killed in a plane crash July 27 near Naknet, Alaska, while on a mission to evacuate patients by air transports, according to an Associated Press dispatch.

She was assigned to an air evacuation squad attached to the Army Air Forces of the Alaska Defense Command, the dispatch said.

Lieut. Gardiner was born in Calgary, Alberta, Canada, and came to the United States when she was 3 years old. She attended Sacred Heart High School here and was employed at St. Elizabeth Hospital, New York; St. Agnes Hospital, White Plains, N.Y., and the Indiana University medical center here before entering the Army Nurse Corps in January.

The announcement was made by Maj. Gen. H. S. Aurand, commanding general of the Sixth Service Command. The hospital has been converted from the Chicago Beach Hotel.

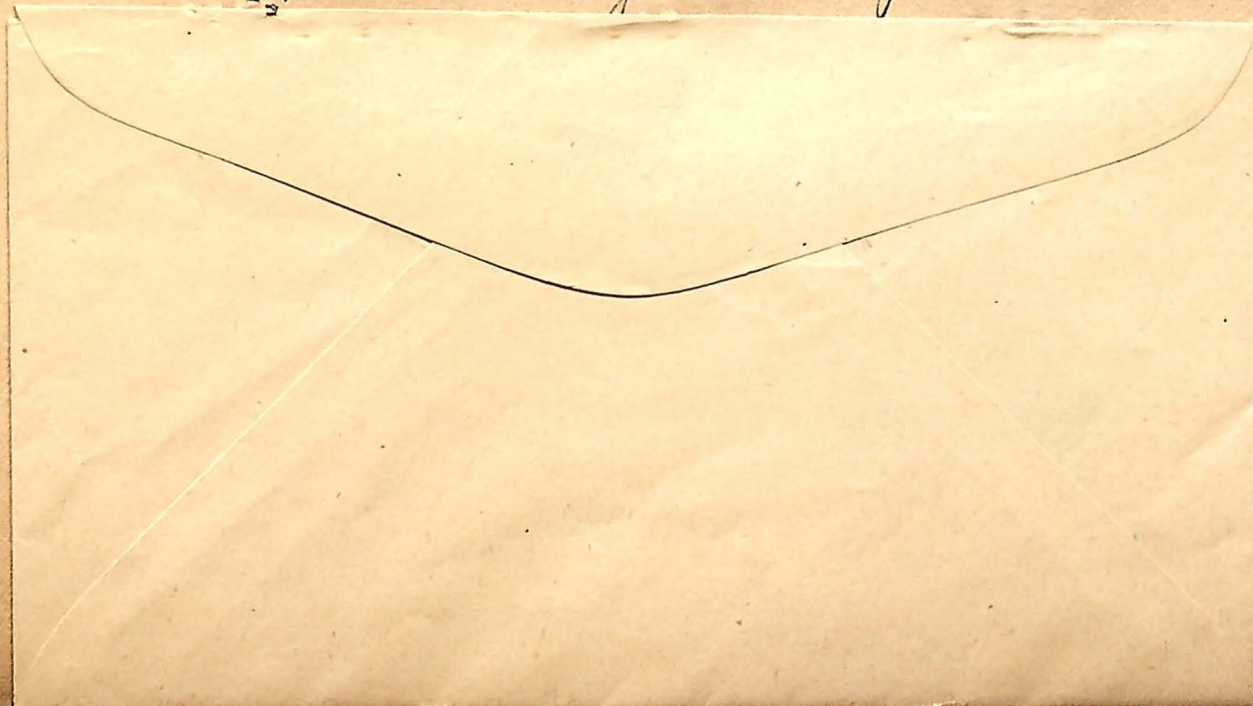

Second Lieutenant Winifred Zirkle of the Army Nurses Corps, formerly of Indianapolis, has been



awarded the air medal for meritorious achievement in the evacuation of sick and wounded from the Aleutian area during the period of April 13, 1943 to June 20, 1944, it was announced yesterday.

Lieut. Zirkle, who has more than 500 hours in the air to her credit, was commended by the commander of the 11th Air Force for her participation in air evacuation activity over dangerous territory and in face of perilous weather conditions.

One of First Overseas.

She is a sister of Mrs. Mabel Metz, 883 West drive, Woodruff Place, and is a 1932 graduate of the Indiana University training school for nurses. She entered the Army Nurses Corps in January, 1943, and was a member of the first unit to be graduated from the air evacuation nurses school at Bowman field, Kentucky.

Lieut. Zirkle was one of five members of her unit, the first of

evacuation nurses to be sent overseas in this war, to receive the award. A sixth member of the unit, Lieut. Ruth M. Gardiner of Indianapolis, was killed in an airplane crash last July. An army hospital in Chicago, the Gardiner General Hospital, was named in her honor.

SECOND LT. WINIFRED ZIRKLE of the army nurses corps has been awarded the air medal for meritorious achievement in the evacuation of sick and wounded from the Aleutian area from April 13, 1943, until June 20, 1944.

A former Indianapolis resident, Lt. Zirkle is the sister of Mrs. Mabel Metz, 883 West dr., Woodruff pl. She graduated from Indiana university training school for nurses in 1932 and entered the army nurses training corps in January, 1943.

She was graduated from the Swayzee, Ind., high school and attended surgery school at Johns Hopkins university, Baltimore, Md. She was supervisor in surgery at the Indiana university medical center when she enlisted in the nurses corps and was formerly a Red Cross first aid instructor here in Indianapolis.

She has had more than 500 hours in the air and was commended by the commander of the 11th air force for participation in air evacuation activity over dangerous territory and in face of perilous weather conditions.

She was a member of the first unit to graduate from the air evacuation nurses school at Bowman field, Ky., and was one of five members of her unit, the first evacuation nurses to be sent overseas, to receive the air medal.

A sixth member of the unit, Lt. Ruth M. Gardiner, also of Indianapolis, was killed in an airplane crash in July, 1943. The Gardiner General hospital, Chicago, was named in her honor.

The nurse who replaced Lt. Gardiner received a broken leg and now only five nurses remain to carry on in the Aleutians.

ALMOST any day now Mrs. Catherine Hellman of 79 South Eighteenth street, is expecting to receive word that her daughter, Frances M. Hellman, first lieutenant, Army Nurses Corps, has received her captain's bars. First Lieutenant Hellman, who has been overseas since July of 1943, is serving as an inspector of the hospitals in which our American soldiers in France are cared for and seeing to it that they receive the best there is in medical care.

The other afternoon we talked with Lieutenant Hellman's mother in her home on South Eighteenth street, and she told us of her daughter's service experience and joy in her chosen work as follows:

"Our daughter, Frances, has been overseas about twenty months, as she has been out of the States since July of 1943. Frances was graduated from St. Anthony's School of Nursing in 1934. Following her graduation from the local nurses' training school she went to Indianapolis, where she took a six months' course in pediatrics at the Riley Hospital for Crippled Children. She stayed on at Riley Hospital and served as head of Ward K. Well do I recall how Frances had gone over to Riley the Fall following her graduation from St. Anthony's, and she was assigned the duties of assistant supervisor and had only served in that capacity for a month or so when she was assigned those of supervisor.

"Frances was inducted into the army in May of 1942. She went into service as a member of a unit from Riley. Before going overseas she was assigned to Billings Hospital, where she helped care for the wounded soldiers brought from overseas.

"She was in England for about six months—from June until December of '43—during which time she was sent to London, where she was placed in charge of an officers' hospital.

"Frances does not tell us in detail about her work, but she does say in her letters to us that she is busily engaged in inspecting hospitals. She tells us that her job is to go around the hospitals in which our American soldiers are being cared for to see that such institutions are efficiently run. Also she checks on the living quarters in which the nurses are housed to see that such quarters are both sanitary and comfortable. At the present time her duties are of administrative nature, and she is not doing any active nursing.

"Perhaps these incidental remarks which Frances has made here and there in her correspondence would better tell you of her work. Just to mention a few are these:

"I am still enjoying my work very much. Yesterday I made an inspection of one of my large hospitals. The men and nurses are doing a really wonderful job, and the patients praise them highly. In going through the hospitals I always spend time with the patients questioning them as to the care and treatment which they have received all the way from the front.

"Our food is good, and we have plenty. Thought I might try to give you an idea of just about what I do. Our little organization is directly responsible for a group of hospitals. Each hospital is organized along the lines of that with which I came overseas. It is our job to keep them 'on the ball.' My job is to see that the patients get good nursing care. Also to see that the nurses are happy, and that anything pertaining to nursing is run according to army regulations. I have both planned and worked out just how I want it done, and now my job is to successfully put across those ideas and plans of mine to the chief nurses with whom I work. These chief nurses are all captains and majors, as to rank—good nurses all, and they are doing a good job, so really my worries and troubles are not too big.

"I make a complete inspection of every hospital and nurses' quarters once a month, and then I check on the weak spots and weaker units in between. As for the nurses, I try to keep them happy and satisfied, and to do this sometimes means transferring them from one unit to another.

"I am the only nurse in this outfit. There are several officers including our C. O. I have my own office. I work hard and long, but I love my work and the people with whom I work.

"Our daughter, Frances, was graduated from St. Ann's and St. Joseph's Academy. She is one of six children, five girls and a boy, of her father, William J. Hellman and myself. Her brother, Paul Hellman, S 2/c, is serving somewhere overseas in the Pacific.

"Her hobbies? Well, Frances liked to bowl a lot. Bowling and tennis were perhaps her favorite sporting pastimes. My daughter reads a great deal as is evidenced by the fact that all of those books which you see in the bookcase composed her library which she sent home just prior to going overseas. Of course, Frances has always been so busy with her profession of nursing that she hasn't had much time for leisure time activities."

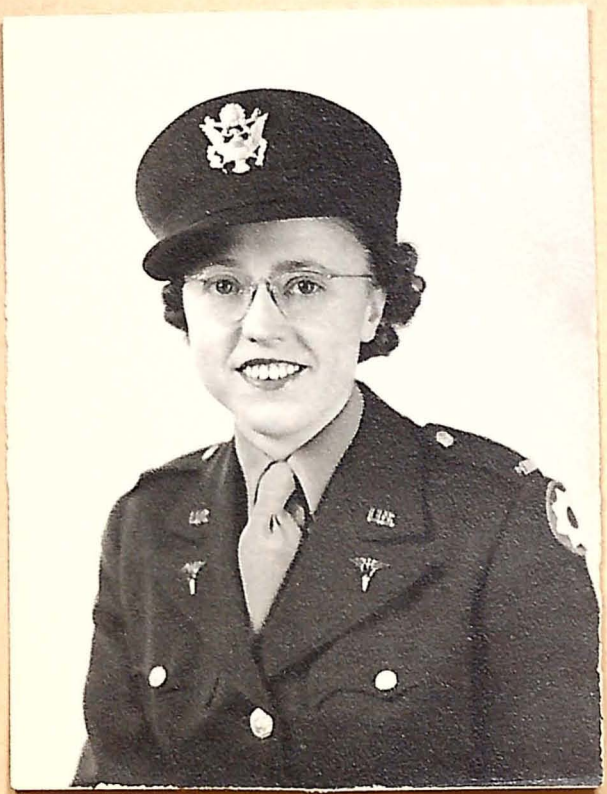

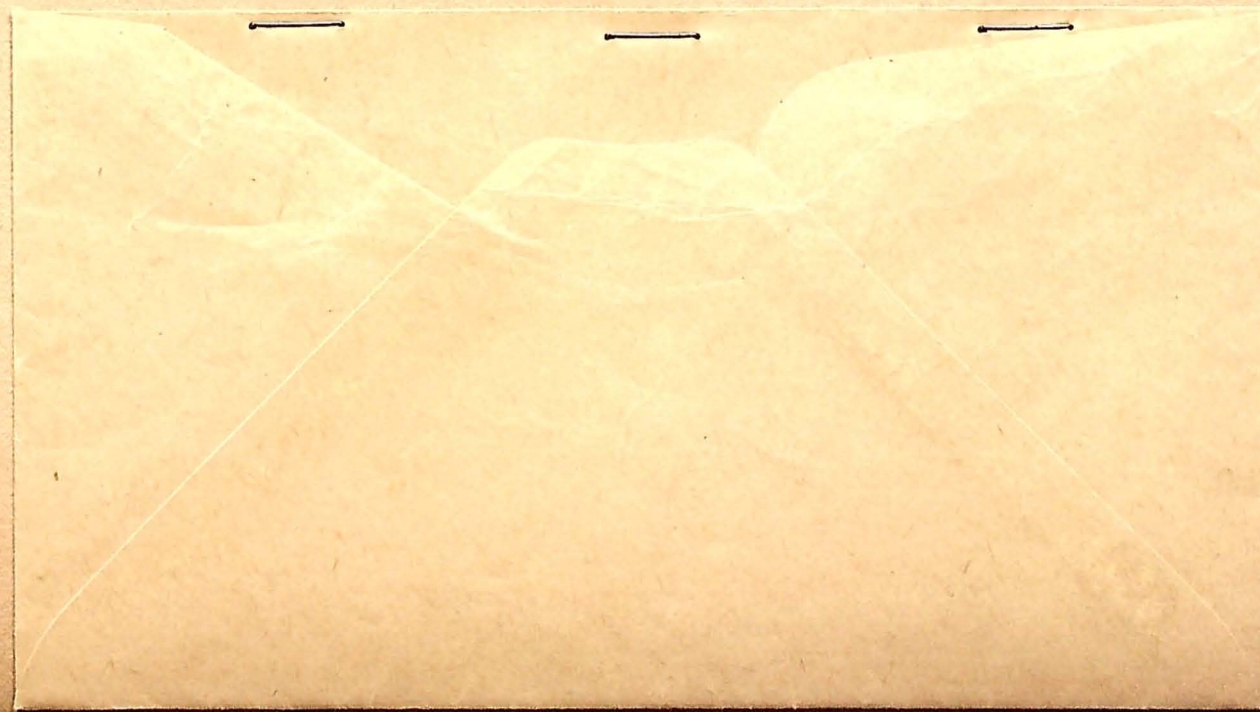

Bring 6840 Veterans From
European Theater.

BOSTON, Oct. 12 (U. P.).—Four troopships carrying 6840 veterans of the European theater, dock here today.

Aboard the M. I. T. Victory were 1935 veterans, including members of the 46th Armored infantry battalion with medics, 5th armored division, 22d armored engineer battalion with medics, six American Red Cross personnel and four other American civilians.

The Rensselaer Victory carried 1950 miscellaneous army personnel. The George Goethels carried 2220 veterans, including members of the 951st field artillery battalion with medics, 218th medical dispensary (aviation) 1763d ordnance medium automotive maintenance platoon (aviation), 700th air material squadron, 59th signal airwarning detachment, 573d bomb squadron (less flight echelon) 63d chemical depot company, 115th chemical processing company, and high score personnel.

The Alexander Graham Bell had 735 veterans, including members of the 100th chemical mortar battalion, U. S. army group, and miscellaneous personnel.

NEW YORK, Oct. 12 (U. P.).—More than 6500 troops were to arrive today on five ships.

The William and Mary Victory carried 1948 troops, including the 395th, 396th and 397th armored field artillery battalions of the 16th armored division.

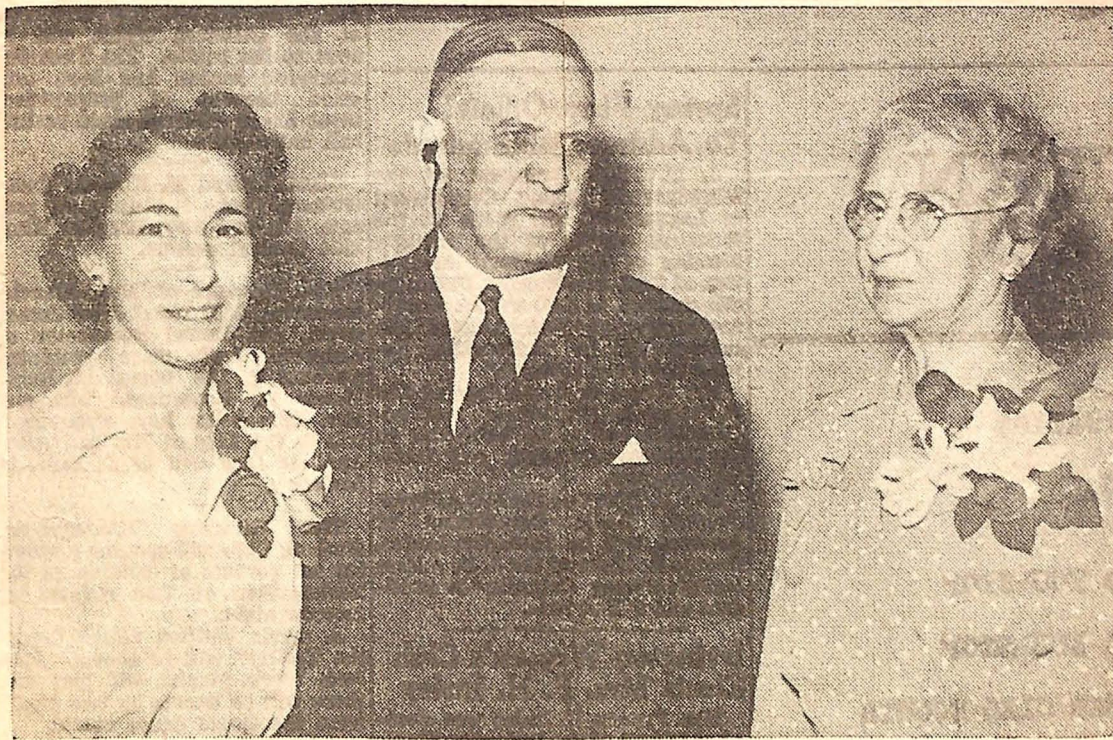

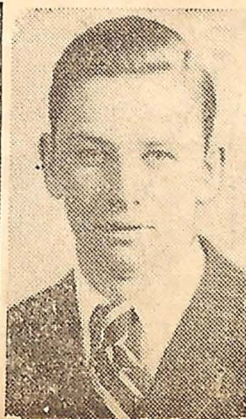
