

MOMENT IN HISTORY

Sunday, November 8th will be the 120th anniversary of the discovery of X Rays by Wilhelm Conrad Roentgen, University of Würzburg. Few scientific discoveries have had such an immediate and profound impact particularly on the disciplines of medicine and dentistry, forever changing patient diagnosis and treatment. The first human radiographic image taken and an ever since famous one, was of the hand of his wife, Bertha. Of note, Roentgen was awarded the first Nobel Prize in physics in 1901 for his discovery of x rays.
