SECTION B. The dues of any local chapter shall be fixed by a majority vote of the membership of that chapter.

ARTICLE VIII. AMENDMENTS

SECTION A. Amendments to the State constitution shall be submitted in writing by the delegates from any chapter at any annual State Convention of "Future Farmers." Amendments may be adopted by a two-thirds vote of the delegates present. *provided they don't interfere with the Nat. Constitution*

SECTION B. In order to secure flexibility, by-laws may be adopted to fit the needs of the State organization or local chapter, provided they are not in conflict with the State constitution, which is also the constitution for each chapter. *2721*

ARTICLE IX. INSIGNIA

SECTION A. The insignia of the Future Farmers of America shall be made up of four symbols, namely
(1) cross section of an ear of corn, representing common agricultural interests, since corn is native to America and grown in every State; (2) the owl, representing wisdom; (3) the plow, representing tillage of the soil, the basis of modern agriculture; and (4) the rising sun, representing progress.

SECTION B. All active, associate and honorary members shall be entitled to wear the insignia. All "Green Hands" are entitled to wear a bronze insignia. All "Future Farmers" are entitled to wear a gold insignia. All members elected to the degree of "State Farmer" are entitled to wear the gold insignia on a key. *emblem*

ARTICLE I. Name and Purposes of the Organization -

SECTION A. The name of this organization shall be the Mississippi Association of Future Farmers of America. Members of local chapters are hereinafter referred to as the Future Farmers of America.

SECTION B. The purposes for which this organization is formed are as follows:

1. To promote vocational education in agriculture in the public schools of the State of Mississippi.
- ✓ 2. To create more interest in the intelligent choice of farming occupations.
- ✓ 3. To create and nurture a love of country life.
- ✓ 4. To encourage recreational and educational activities for students in vocational agriculture.
- ✓ 5. To promote thrift.
- ✓ 6. To encourage co-operative effort among students of vocational agriculture.
- ✓ 7. To strengthen the confidence of the farm boy in himself and his work.
- ✓ 8. To promote scholarship among students of vocational agriculture.
- ✓ 9. To develop rural leadership.

ARTICLE II. ORGANIZATION

SECTION A. The Mississippi Association of Future Farmers of America is a State organization of affiliated local chapters in schools having organized instruction in vocational agriculture under the provisions of the Smith-Hughes Act.

SECTION B. Local "Future Farmer" chapters shall not be organized in schools where systematic instruction in vocational agriculture is not given under the provisions of the Smith-Hughes Act.

SECTION C. Members of local chapters shall meet, organize and adopt the State constitution as their own, elect officers, set up a program of work, and then apply to the State secretary for membership in the State Organization. After

SECTION C. "Future Farmer." Qualifications for Election:

1. Satisfactory completion of at least one year in vocational agriculture including a program of supervised practice. *farming*
2. Earn and deposit in a bank, or otherwise productively invest at least \$25.

Note - Any modification of (2) above must be approved by the State adviser.

3. Be regularly enrolled in vocational agriculture with an amplified supervised practice program. *farming*

5. Be able to lead a group discussion for ten minutes.
6. Receive a majority vote of the members present at a regular local chapter meeting of "Future Farmers of America".

SECTION D. "State Farmer." Qualifications for Election:

The qualifications for election are left to the various State organizations. The following qualifications are *minimus* *simply* suggestive:

1. At least two years of systematic instruction in vocational agriculture with an outstanding supervised practice program in operation. *farming*
2. Pass some occupational test supplied by the State staff
3. Earn and deposit in a bank, or productively invest at least \$200. This may include the \$25 saved while advancing to the grade of "Future Farmer".

Be familiar with parliamentary procedure by having held office in the local chapter.

5. Be able to lead a group discussion for 40 minutes.
6. Make the school judging team, debating team, or some other team representing the school..
7. Show marked attainment in scholarship in all school subjects (grade 85 or above).
8. Possess qualities for leadership as shown by having held responsible positions in connection with student and chapter activities.
9. Each state shall be entitled to elect ten qualified

individuals but where the state membership exceeds 500, not more than 2 per cent of the total State membership may be elected, fractions counted to the nearest whole number. Only copies of written records of achievement verified by the local adviser shall be submitted to the State adviser by the local executive committee at least one month prior to the State convention. The adviser will then review the records and submit his findings to the State Executive Committee. This committee will nominate at the regular State Convention the candidates who have been found most worthy to receive the honor. Synopses of these records shall then be read by a member of the Executive Committee when the students are nominated. The delegates shall then proceed to elect to the "Third degree" the number of candidates to which the State is entitled.

SECTION E. "American Farmer". Qualifications for Election:

1. Hold the degree of State Farmer in the school year previous to the National Congress at which nominated for the degree of American Farmer. *convention*
 2. Be engaged in a farming occupation or have definite plans for becoming a farmer.
 3. Possess demonstrated ability to farm by having conducted an outstanding program of supervised practice throughout the period of vocational training. *farming*
 4. Earn and deposit in a bank or otherwise productively invest at least \$500.

Note. - In cases where the applicant has assisted in the support of dependents the amount so expended, in the judgment of the National Board of Trustees, may be considered as an investment.

5. Possess demonstrated ability to work with others by having participated in some agricultural cooperative enterprise or movement.
6. Be recommended by the National Board of Trustees and receive a majority vote of the delegates present at a National Congress of Future Farmers of America. *Convention*

SECTION F. Associate and honorary members shall not vote nor shall they hold any office except that of adviser in the State and local organizations and that of Executive Secretary-Treasurer and Adviser in the National Organization. Exceptions to this provision are permitted during the first ~~two~~ years of a chapter's existence.

SECTION G. Only members who have been elected to the grade of "American Farmer" are eligible to hold national offices after 1934. One year after the Mississippi organization has

this application has been approved by the State Secretary the members of the local chapter may then be known as Future Farmers of America.

ARTICLE III. MEMBERSHIP

SECTION A. Membership in this organization shall be active, associate and honorary.

SECTION B. Active membership. Any male student of vocational agriculture, who is regularly enrolled in a part-time, day-unit or all-day class, is entitled to active membership in "Future Farmer" chapters upon receiving a majority vote of the members present at any chapter meeting. A member may retain his active membership for three years after completing his systematic instruction in vocational agriculture. *? regular*

SECTION C. Associate membership. After three years active membership following the completion of his systematic instruction in vocational agriculture a boy automatically becomes an associate member of the Future Farmers of America. Any former male student of vocational agriculture may be elected to associate membership upon receiving a majority vote of the members present at any chapter meeting. *? regular*

SECTION D. Honorary membership. Instructors, school principals, superintendents, farmers, business men and others ~~men~~ who are helping to promote vocational agriculture may be elected to honorary membership by a majority vote of the members present at any meeting. *req.*

ARTICLE IV. MEMBERSHIP GRADES AND PRIVILEGES

SECTION A. There shall be four grades of membership based upon achievement. These grades are (1) Green hand, (2) Future Farmer, (3) State farmer and (4) American farmer.

SECTION B. "Green Hand". Qualifications for Election:

1. Fourteen years of age.
2. Be regularly enrolled in a class in vocational agriculture.
3. Possess facilities for and have a satisfactory program of supervised practice.
4. Receive a majority vote of the members present at a regular meeting of the local chapter of "Future Farmers of America".

been chartered all State officers shall have attained the "State Farmer" degree. Officers in the local chapters must not rank lower than the grade of "Future Farmer" one year after the chapter is chartered.

SECTION H. Associate and honorary members are eligible to election to any degree provided they have done outstanding work in promoting vocational agriculture and the organization of Future Farmers of America. (2)

ARTICLE V. OFFICERS

SECTION A. 1. The officers of the Mississippi Association of Future Farmers of America shall consist of a president, vice-president, secretary, treasurer, adviser and reporter. These officers shall be elected annually by a majority vote of the delegates present at a regular State convention of "Future Farmers". The officers shall perform the usual duties of the respective officers. Each local chapter shall be entitled to two delegates in the State convention, who shall represent the local chapter in balloting for officers and members who are nominated to be advanced to the grade of "State Farmer".

2. Officers of the local chapter shall be identical with those for the State organization and shall be elected annually at a regular meeting of the local chapter.

SECTION B. The executive committee of the State organization of Future Farmers of America shall consist of the State officers ex-officio and three active members elected by the delegates in State convention. This committee shall perform the usual duties of an executive committee, review and approve receipts and disbursements, act as a nominating committee, and be responsible for the welfare of the organization.

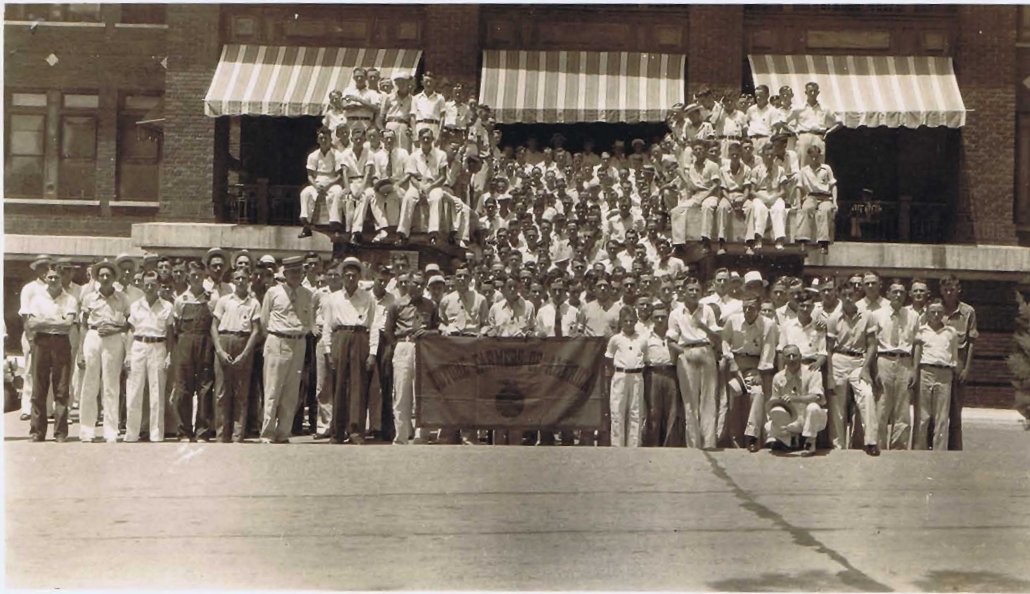
ARTICLE VI. MEETINGS

SECTION A. A meeting of the State Convention of Future Farmers of America will be held annually and at least 30 days prior to the meeting of the National Congress of Future Farmers of America, at such time and place as may be determined upon by the State Executive Committee. *Convention*

SECTION B. Local chapters shall hold their meetings monthly or oftener and at such time and place as may be decided upon by the Executive Committee of the Local Chapter.

ARTICLE VII. DUES

SECTION A. Membership dues in a State organization shall be fixed by the State Executive Committee subject to approval by a

STATE PROGRAM OF WORK FOR MISSISSIPPI ASSOCIATION
OF F. F. A. FOR 1934-35
(Adopted at State Convention July 17-21, 1934)

I. Promotion -

A. Assist in organization of new Chapters

1. In 50% of schools having vocational agriculture.
2. In formation of District Chapters in accord with State District subdivisions or portions thereof.
3. Chapters to reach 50% of students enrolled in vocational agriculture to become members.
4. Chapters already chartered to assist others in setting up local chapters.

II. Finance -

A. State dues to be 50¢ per year to be used as follows:

- 10¢ to National Association
- 19¢ for Green Hand buttons
- 5¢ for keys for Mississippi State Farmers
- 16¢ to be used as organization sees fit

B. A goal of \$20,000.00 to be deposited in Thrift accounts and in individual savings accounts.

C. A goal of \$50,000.00 to be invested in farming and other investments.

III. Contests -

A. Will promote all contests promoted by National Organization.

B. Will promote all State and District contests.

IV. Leadership -

A. Leadership training will be promoted through district and local chapters.

V. Publicity -

A. A committee to be appointed to study publication of a State F. F. A. magazine.

B. Each local chapter to use local paper for reporting F. F. A. activities.

VI. Recreation -

A. District advisers to act as committeemen according to District Subdivisions of State and report to State Adviser with reference to Recreation and recreation facilities. Reports to be turned over to committee on Recreation and Camping.

B. Local chapter adviser to promote local Recreation and Camping program.

PROGRAM OF WORK FOR LOCAL CHAPTERS - 1934-35

1. At least one regular meeting per school month and one meeting during summer months.
 - a. Use opening and closing ceremonies at all regular meetings.
 - b. All officers memorize parts.
 - c. Each chapter have a manual for each officer and one handbook for the chapter.
2. Participate in chapter contest.
 - a. The winner of the district to be determined by a committee selected by the advisers of that district based upon National score card for National Contest.
 - b. District prizes to be recommended by State Adviser and provided locally.
 - c. State prizes to be awarded by State Association.
3. Every chapter participate in Public Speaking Contest.
4. Every chapter participate in Dairy and Livestock Judging contests.
5. Have complete official equipment for chapter ceremonies.
6. Begin Chapter Hall of Fame.
7. Each chapter keep annual scrap book.
8. Conduct one or more cooperative chapter projects.
9. Every chapter to make budget early in year of proposed expenditure and also plan of raising funds to meet budget.
10. Every chapter have Father and Son banquet using official opening and closing ceremonies.
11. Each chapter to have some definitely planned Thrift Program.
12. Each chapter to incorporate in its objective the State F. F.A. objectives for 1934-35.
