**NLCSO Task Force:** A three-year program review task force will be looking at the content and structure of the National Leadership Conference for State Officers (NLCSO) Nov. 5-7, 2004 in Indianapolis. The task force consists of one state leader from each of the nine NLCSO locations, an expert in evaluation from the collegiate level, a past national officer familiar with the program, representatives from the National FFA Board of Directors and a sponsor of the program. The following is a listing of the expected outcomes from this task force:

- Review and identify relevant and appropriate NLCSO program objectives
- Review and identify National FFA Mission precepts and standards to be met through student learning objectives
- Identify the necessary assessment requirements for evaluating both student learning and program objectives

- Identify instructional and program components required to meet the stated program and learning objectives
- Identify and prioritize recommendations regarding conference delivery

For state leaders involved in state officer programming, be looking for information during the month of October.
