The democratic side of the US presidential election is heating up, with candidates Hillary Clinton & Barack Obama both chasing the party's nomination. The Indiana primary will be held on May 6th and the close race means Indiana's vote will be important. Last Tuesday, IUPUI's Student Democrats hosted Chelsea Clinton and actor Sean Astin in a town hall meeting held in the IUPUI Campus Center. Take a look:

[Chelsea Clinton] Hello, everyone. Hi. Thank you for being here with us today. Thank you to the College Democrats for your warm welcome. I don't know if you all know this, but you can still register for close to another month here in Indiana.

Her question was "what is my mom's plan on the economy," because she knows it's taken some hard hits under this administration. We know we need to do some things immediately, and some things longer-term on the economy. Immediately, we need to deal with our housing crisis. And, my mother, more than a year ago, said that we were going to have a housing crisis in our country. And, that we were going to be driven into a housing crisis because of sub-prime mortgages, and we needed to be doing more to help people stay in their homes. And, congress wasn't really interested, and the president certainly wasn't interested.

So, her question was "what are my mom's plans to make college more affordable". It's a great question in a college setting. And, one of the things that I am really proud of my mom for that is really distinctive to her is that she doesn't only talk about college affordability and accessibility, but also graduate school affordability and accessibility. So it's not only helping college be more affordable, but graduate school more affordable.

[A. Bonilla] The Cesar Chavez dinner is the first of its kind here in Indiana and on IUPUI's campus, for that matter. It is a dinner celebration to honor Cesar Chavez, who was a labor rights activist back in the 1960's and worked for the advancement of the Latino community for fair wages and unionizing of Latino migrant workers. So, we feel it is important to have a dinner in celebration of his works. The dinner is the same weekend as his birthday. There's going to be an award ceremony giving out different awards to the community, and to students, faculty and staff, for their accomplishments with the Latino community. We are also going to have a speaker. His name is Baldemar Velaszuez and he is the president of FLOC, which is the Farm Labor

Organizing Committee. His life is parallel to that of Cesar Chavez. He, too, is working for the unionizing of migrant workers.

Tickets are on sale at the Campus & Community Life office. Tickets for IUPUI students, undergraduate and graduate, are free. You just need to go and show your JagTag, and you can get a free ticket. All non-IUPUI students are \$20, and faculty, staff and community tickets are \$35. All tickets are on sale now in the Campus & Community Life office.
