Self-empowerment project creates a source of livelihood

During the December 2015 visit of Mr. Anwar Khan to Khulna Gilatala camp, ten goats were distributed among widows under a pilot self empowerment project. This year, in May, a follow up was done to gauge the

progress of the project. Two of the goats have given birth to kids. The families who received the goats will give the first kid to another family. Gradually the goats will be given to other deserving families. This project will ultimately help to reduce the poverty faced by the widows by providing them with an income generating opportunity.

Arabic education program makes good progress

An Arabic education program was started in Khulna in 2005. At present, 72 students are learning Qaida and Quran from this program. A total of 205 students have learned to read the Quran so far, from this center.

Another Arabic Education program in Syedpur was started in the year 2000 and run by the local community initially. In 2011, OBAT took over this center. Seventy-six students are studying there at present and 404 students have finished reading the Quran from this center.

Chittagong tutoring center is going strong!

The Chittagong tutoring Center has been very successful in improving the quality of education received by students. Initially, it was found that the camp students' results were very poor. At present, 161 students

from grade six to ten are receiving coaching from this center and gradually their results are improving. Most of the students were from commerce or humanities group, but now a good number of students belong to the science group. OBAT is running seven tutoring centers presently at Dhaka, Chittagong, Khulna, Rangpur, Syedpur and Mymensingh. In all, 646 students are receiving educational support from those centers.
