Dr. Kelton Stewart, tenured Associate Professor of Orthodontics and Oral Facial Genetics, has been named as the inaugural James J. Baldwin Associate Professor of Orthodontics. His nomination, sup-

Dr. Stewart received his DDS (2006), Masand Certificate in Orthodontics (2008) from Baylor College of Dentistry, Texas A&M University in Dallas, Texas. He joined the faculty of Indiana University School of Dentistry in 2008 as an Assistant Professor and was promoted to the rank of Associate Professor in 2015 and received tenure in 2016.
