Direktor Rath berichtete über eine Vorführung der Seminarklasse vor dem Gouverneur Goodrich und seinem Stab am 13. April.

Auf Stempfels Antrag wurde beschlossen, bei den Abiturienten des Seminars anzufragen, ob sie willens sind, bei der Ausbildung der Rekruten der zu schaffenden Armee mitzuhelfen. Ferner wurde Direktor Rath beauftragt, in dieser Sache an Captain Herm. Koehler in West Point zu schreiben.

Rath unterbreitete einen Bericht über die Einflüsse, welche die Seminaristen zum Besuch der Anstalt veranlaßten; ebenso das Ergebnis ~~der~~ einer Abstimmung der Seminaristen über die Ausdehnung des Kursus auf drei Jahre.

Ferner berichtete Rath, daß er beabsichtige, in der ersten Maiwoche seine Reise zur Besichtigung anderer Turnlehrerausbildungsanstalten anzutreten.

Stempfel moved to ask the Seminary graduates whether they would be willing to assist by the training of the recruits of the future army. Motion granted. In addition, Dean Rath was instructed to write to Captain Herm. Koehler in West Point regarding this matter.

Dean Rath presented a report about what motivates our students to attend the institution and also about the result of students' vote on the prolonging of the course to three years.

In addition, Rath reported that he plans to go on his trip to visit other gymnastic teachers' education institutions in the first week of May.
