


# Alumni State Leaders' Conference





# New Guidelines for 1990 Legion of Merit Award

Starting in 1990, the Legion of Merit Award will be presented to anyone signing up 15 or more new or renewal FFA Alumni members, five life members, or five FFA Executive Sponsors. Applications must be postmarked by October 1, 1990, to be eligible to receive the certificate at the 1990 National FFA Alumni Convention. Application forms may be copied from the new manual or requested from the national office.

#### **Convention Business Items**

The only convention business items recommended for delegate action by the national council will be to continue both annual and life dues at \$6.00 and \$100.00 through 1991.

#### **Council Approves More WCP Scholarships**

Starting in 1990, active FFA Alumni states with less than 500 alumni members will receive a Washington Conference Program scholarship based on fifty cents per member. For example, a state with 200 members will receive a \$100.00 scholarship. These scholarships will be presented at the 1990 national convention for use in the summer of 1991. Scholarships worth \$300.00 will continue to be awarded to states for every 500 active alumni members and to local affiliates for every 250 active alumni members or 100 life members. Over \$18,000.00 in WCP scholarships is presently given to FFA members.

#### New Revised FFA Alumni Manual


