## From the Desk of the EAD/ADFA



And so the New Year and the new semester begin. A Happy New Year to everyone and I hope you enjoyed some relaxation and a recharge of the batteries. You will have seen the impressive progress being made with the new construction, despite the intermittent vagaries of the weather.

I strongly encouraged him to consider stopping by IUSD during one of his occasional visits to share his experience.

It was also a valuable opportunity to spend extended time with colleagues from the senior administration of the Vice President's Office of International Affairs and discuss the University's vision of globalization in



higher education. From this campus, Dr. Kathy Pike, Associate Dean, Department of Social Work and I attended, but others from IUB were Dr. Lee Feinstein, Dean of the recently established School of Global and International Studies and Dr. Hannah Buxbaum, from the Maurer School of Law, but also in her capacity as Director of the IU European Gateway, based in Berlin. She reminded me to encourage any faculty who may be or have an interest in working with colleagues in Europe (not only Germany) that there are considerable resources available to assist in hosting meetings, seminars and workshops in the Gateway.

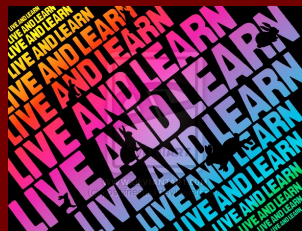
## GLADDEN NAMED AVC

## Work on Your FASR Now

This is a gentle reminder that the Faculty Annual Summary Report (FASR) is due **Friday, February 3, 2017 at 5:00 pm**. It will take more time than you expect to enter your 2016 information so don't delay, start now.



Activity Insight (AI), the new reporting platform, is very different than the FAR. There are a variety of [resources](#) available and [FAQs](#) to help you navigate the system and provide instruction on how to enter data. The [Faculty User Guide](#) is extremely helpful and worth downloading and printing to have at hand while entering data into the system. The AI platform can be accessed via <https://one.iu.edu/>. First do a search for Activity Insight

and then sign-in using the Central Authentication Service (CAS) log-in procedure.

Two additional training programs are available this month on January 17th and 23rd for you to attend. See page 6 for program details and registration links.

Required documents to append in the supplemental section are your:

1. Curriculum Vitae
2. Individual Faculty Career Plan

Remember that the information provided by the faculty member in the FASR is used in completing the Annual Review, which is an IUPUI mandated [annual review](#) for all faculty.

[Trustees' Teaching Award 2017](#) information is available via this link. To be eligible for the award, the faculty member must complete the FASR by the deadline (February 3 by 5 pm) and append the required CV and Career Plan documents to the report as stated previously. Self and/or peer nominations will be

accepted by e-mail notification to Shelley Hall [shall@iu.edu](mailto:shall@iu.edu) on or before 5 pm on Friday, February 3rd.

The TTA honors individuals who have a positive impact on learning through the direct teaching of students. Award recipients must have demonstrated a sustained level of teaching excellence in the form of documented student learning and must have completed at least three years of service at IUPUI.

This year, the School of Dentistry has been allotted 4 TTA awards: 2 for tenure-track/tenured faculty and 2 for clinical-track/lecturer faculty. Each awardee will receive \$2,500 for the TTA and will be recognized during the Chancellor's Academic Honors Convocation on Friday, April 21, 2017 at 3:00 pm in the Hine Hall Auditorium..

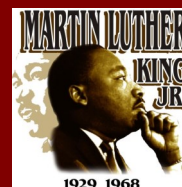
Faculty who received a TTA award in 2014 and 2015 are not eligible for the current award cycle.

## RETTIG SELECTED FOR FACULTY LEARNING COMMUNITY

Pamela Rettig, Clinical Associate Professor, Dental Hygiene Division, Department of Periodontics and Allied Dental Programs, has been accepted into the [Role of Reflection in SoTL Faculty Learning Community](#). Prof. Rettig was selected for participation in this FLC from a group of faculty from various disciplines and levels of prior experience with critical reflection and teaching through an application process.

The purpose of this faculty learning community (FLC) is to explore the process of critical reflection about teaching and to determine specific ways in which each faculty member will incorporate critical reflection into their teaching practices. The FLC will work to 1) Foster self-examination of teaching practices in a safe and supportive community, 2) Expose participants to theories and practices of reflective teaching, 3) Integrate the science of learning into the practice of teaching, 4) Support the integration of critical reflection into ongoing teaching practices, 5) Generate enthusiasm for scholarly teaching, and 6) Develop and disseminate scholarly products resulting from the application of critical reflection. The FLC will begin its work this month and continue through the end of the year. Each participant receives a stipend of \$1,000 for professional development related to reflection and scholarship. # Faculty Recruitment Update



The beginning of this calendar year is filled with promise as a few of our departments begin interviewing for key positions within the School of Dentistry.

The Search & Screen Committee for the position of department chair of [Orthodontics and Oral Facial Genetics](#) is scheduled to meet in the next few days to review its

current applicant pool and begin setting an interview schedule. The goal is to have a new department chair in place before the current department chair, Dr. Katherine Kula, caps her transition toward retirement on December 31, 2017.

Oral Pathology, Medicine, and Radiology's Search and Screen Committee for an assistant professor with [expertise in oral and maxillofacial radiology](#) also will be meeting later this month to begin reviewing that position's applicant pool and scheduling

candidate interviews.

Assistant/associate professor applicants are being recruited for Cariology, Operative Dentistry and Dental Public Health. One of the primary foci for [this position](#) will be development of robust community-based rotations and programs for our students.

Two of the school's visiting faculty appointments will be expiring on June 30th, one in Periodontics and Allied Dental Programs (posted) and the other in Biomedical and Applied Sciences (to be posted soon).

## CAS Duo Log-in Required

→ Log in

Beginning January 3, 2017, all IU employees will be required to use two-step verification to log in to IU's Central Authentication Service, or CAS. Two-step login adds an extra layer of security in accessing your account and information.

To sign up for two-step login, you will first need to select your device. You can use a smartphone or tablet, a landline or simple phone, or a passcode key fob/Duo token. You will then enter in your device's information, and Duo will contact you one of several ways: through push notifications from the Duo mobile app, phone calls or text messages, or you can generate login

codes from the single-button Duo hardware token. If you choose to use the Duo app, it is available for free in both the iTunes and Google Play app stores. After downloading, follow the directions to set up two-step verification. For more information on the process of signing up for two-step login, see <https://access.iu.edu/twostep#how-it-works>.

Once you enroll in two-step login, you will receive a confirmation email. You can also find information on managing your devices at <https://access.iu.edu/twostep/Manage>. Be aware that if you are unable to login in to two-step with Duo (e.g. your device is inoperable, lost, stolen, or not on your person) then the only support option will be for you

to come in person to a campus walk-in Support Center and show a valid picture ID in order to regain access to your account. UITS support will not bypass the added security from Duo that you have enabled.

## MAYNARD K. HINE AWARD



Dr. Anderson Hara, Associate Professor, Department of Cariology, Operative Dentistry and Dental Public Health and Chair of the 2017 Maynard K. Hine Award Committee, has issued a call to graduate students and their mentors to submit a research paper based on their graduate project to compete for this prestigious award.

The award was created to recognize excellence in research and to encourage dental graduate students to continue in dental research. The award consists of a certificate and a cash prize. The award is sponsored and administered by the Indiana Section of the AADR-IADR.

To be eligible for this award, the student must have been registered in the Indiana University, IUPUI, or Purdue University Graduate program at the time the research was done. The research project has to be done with an IUSD faculty member. Application must be made while a graduate student or within one year after graduation. The PDF file of the paper along with a cover letter signed by the student's mentor must be received by 5 pm, Wednesday, March 1, 2017. # IUSD Building News

The new year brings further development and continued progress on the many projects underway in and around the School of Dentistry. Building Manager, Adam Smith, has provided the following updates to keep us in the know about the various projects that impact dental faculty, staff and students. The Fritts Clinical Center continues to take on new form as more of the structural steel arrives and the utility connection work continues. To follow the progress firsthand, visit the [webcam](#) to witness the changes that continue to occur on a daily basis.

To enable further progress, several road closures around the dental school are still planned but the time frames have been revised. With regard to Michigan Street,

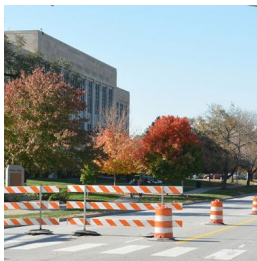
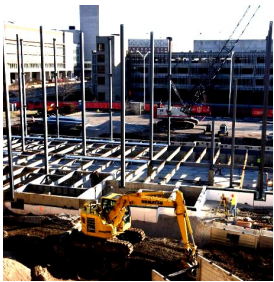
mother nature and logistics have slowed down the activities but an uptick is expected during the next several weeks (January 3-20). The subcontractor installing the underground utilities has committed resources to the project and mobilized those over the winter break, focusing on the areas west of Barnhill and the intersection of University Boulevard and Michigan Street. Use care and caution as you navigate through the construction area.

The southbound lane closures on Barnhill will begin on January 16th through January 29th. The northbound lanes will be reconfig-

ured to handle traffic traveling in both directions. Once the Barnhill work is complete, Vermont Street will see a longer shutdown of approximately three weeks, beginning on or around February 6th through the 26th.

Another part of the building project is the removal of the old generator and replacing it with a new one on the west side of the building near the dock area. The current generator takes up considerable space in what is to be the new dental school courtyard, and needs to be relocated. Logistics are still being worked out, and teams are trying to coordinate schedules around the new facility construction project. The generator will be removed, but whether it goes as one unit or in parts is yet to be determined as contractors and contractual arrangements still need to be made. A temporary generator has been placed on the north side of the building to accommodate the time period between the removal of the old and the placement of the new unit.

In addition to the new building construction and street renovations, the remodeling of room 245 or the Dr. Howard R. Raper Conference room continues. This project is on schedule for total remodeling which includes a technology upgrade. Completion is expected by the end of the month.
