A Plan for Normal College Scholarships

Three scholarships to be established which are to be granted under the following rules:

The districts of the North American Gymnastic Union will be divided into three sections to be known as the East, Middle West and West. One scholarship will be offered to a young man from each section. The district receiving the privilege will be selected by the National Executive Committee of the N. A. G. U. (Rotate.)

The young men selected must be recommended by the committees on physical training and mental culture of the District Executive Committee which will pass upon the final acceptance. The men granted the scholarship obligate themselves to continue (or begin) the study of German.

Young men recommended for scholarships should possess the following qualifications:

1. They should be well proportioned in build and not less than 5'6" in height.
2. Their gymnastic proficiency should be such that they can perform kippes and swing rises on horizontal and parallel bars and the various vaults over side and long horse.
3. They should possess fair ability in performing the popular track and field events.
4. The grades received by them in their high school studies must ~~make~~ average not less than 80%.
5. Importance must be placed upon the selection with ~~first~~ reference to personality and character. The character of the young men must be above reproach and their personality such that it will be appropriate for the profession selected. The Normal College should certainly regret to give this opportunity to unworthy young men.

This scholarship is for the two-year course and consists of free tuition and books.

Meeting on October 27, 1917.

Present: F. Vonnegut, Rath, Pantzer, Scherer, Lieber and G. Vonnegut.

Dean Rath reported that only 33 students were willing to get accident insurance and because of that, the plan had to be dropped. Decided to route the issue back to the committee instructing them to continue to work on creating a plan to protect the Seminary against compensation demands in the case of an accident and, in addition, to inquire by other institutions how they handle this matter.

Rath reported that one woman and three men have joined the Seminary since the last meeting so the class now numbers 86, 30 men and 56 women.

The scholarship committee, Rath, Scherer and Stecher, submitted a plan for the award of scholarships to gymnastic union members. Decided to table this issue until the meeting at the end of November when the out of town members will be present.

Dr. Ziegler donated several volumes of the American Physical Education Review to the Seminary library. Decided to express the Board's gratitude to him.

Dean Rath reported that three teachers, Dr. Gnedel, Dr. Maxwell and Dr. Mumford, have joined the army. In addition, he informed us of the plan of the Athletic Board to issue monograms to students who have accumulated a certain number of points in various subjects.

A number of basketball games have been arranged already. The committee dealing with this and other matter consists of Rath, Westing, Altmann, Thoma, Reuter and Hoelscher.
