GOVERNING COMMITTEE OF THE FUTURE FARMERS OF AMERICA  
Washington, D.C.

December 29, 1965


The meeting of the Governing Committee of the FFA was called to order by H. N. Hunsicker, Chairman. Others present included E. J. Johnson and W. P. Gray (members of the Committee). Mr. Gray also served as Secretary.

Mr. Hunsicker reviewed a letter received from Mr. W. T. Johnson, former NFA Executive Treasurer asking that the bond for him as Treasurer be extended until March 1, since he was still closing out the financial records of the NFA. It was moved by Mr. Gray, seconded by Mr. Johnson and carried that his bond be extended to March 1, and that he be authorized to pay the premium from the NFA Treasury.

It was moved by Mr. Johnson, seconded by Mr. Gray and carried that Mr. W. T. Johnson be asked to come to Washington on January 24 to report to the Board of Directors on the progress being made in closing out financial records which would include all expenditure of funds since the merger of the NFA and the FFA, and that the expenses for his travel be paid from funds available to him from the NFA Treasury. It was further suggested that he be used as a consultant regarding the possible reorganization of a National FFA Chorus.

The subject of the FFA Educational Exchange Program with the Young Farmers' Clubs of Great Britain and Scotland was discussed. It was moved by Mr. Johnson, seconded by Mr. Gray and carried that the procedure for selecting representatives be the same as that followed in 1965, namely that the selection be made from 1965 candidates for National FFA Office who were not elected to a national office. Emphasis should be placed on getting participants engaged in agriculture and if possible to come from States not previously participating in the program.
