[S. Reed] The Study Abroad Fair will take place Tuesday, September 2nd from 10:30 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. under the big tent on Taylor Courtyard. IUPUI offers over 40 programs that send you all over the world. We spoke with Stephanie Leslie for more details.

[S. Leslie] Students have the chance to go overseas for an extended period of tie and really come apart of the community. It's not like traveling as a tourist. As a tourist you go from postcard location to postcard location. But with study abroad you're able to spend a significant amount of time in one place. You get to know people. You get to really connect and get a sense of what it's like to live in the place. You go to the grocery stores, you go to the local restaurants ad you get to know people in a way that's just not possible as you're kind of floating in and out as a tourist. At the study abroad fair students will have an opportunity to meet faculty directors and representatives from really over 20 study abroad programs. It's a great opportunity for students to not just talk with the study abroad advisors but to talk with the actual faculty that are leading the programs. They can get a lot of information. Well also have return study abroad students there so they can talk with students about their experience on those individual programs. There will be a representative from the financial aid office so she can explain how financial aid can apply toward study abroad. We'll have a lot of information on scholarships. It's a really great opportunity in a short amount of time to get a really broad array of programs and really get a sense of how study abroad can work for students. [S. Payne] Sure. This is our third year with the Hampton Inn invitational. We're looking to have Hampton Inn sponsor that. We've got three very good teams coming in this year. University of Evansville that was in the middle of the pack last year form Missouri Valley - it's an in-state rival so it's always good competition there. University of Tulsa is coming all the way in. They've got some local girls from Indiana. They were first in the Conference USA Tournament last year, and they went to the NCAA's first round. Then we got Jacksonville State who was an Ohio Valley and tied for first in their conference last year so it's going to be a pretty competitive tournament. Teams from all over are coming in so we're really looking forward to it. Our main goal of the season is to be in the top four of the Summit League because that gives us a birth into the league tournament and then from there we just need to win two more and then make the NCAA tournament so that's our big goal overall. And of course, our other goal is to get a twenty-win season. And I think we have a team that's here to do that.
