

MINUTES OF THE NATIONAL ADVISORY COUNCIL MEETING
FUTURE FARMERS OF AMERICA

Washington, D. C.

- January 27, 1949 -

The meeting was called to order by Dr. W. T. Spanton in Room 4280, Federal Security Agency Building. Those present included Messrs. R. E. Naugher, E. J. Johnson, H. B. Swanson, D. M. Clements, Office of Education, Washington, D. C.; Bert L. Brown, State Supervisor Agricultural Education in Washington; R. D. Anderson, State Supervisor Agricultural Education in South Carolina; E. P. Hilton, State Supervisor Agricultural Education in Kentucky; D. J. Howard, National F.F.A. Treasurer; and A. W. Tenney, National F.F.A. Executive Secretary.

A report of the National Judging Committee was presented.

It was moved by Mr. Hilton that the Advisory Council authorize the Judging Committee to make the rules and regulations of the Judging Contests; motion seconded by Mr. Brown and carried.

It was moved by Mr. Hilton that the general superintendent and division superintendent of the Judging Contest have administrative charge of the conducting of all judging contests; motion seconded by Mr. Anderson and carried.

It was moved by Mr. Brown that the Advisory Council accept the awards provided in the budget of the F.F.A. Foundation; motion seconded by Mr. Anderson and carried.

It was moved by Mr. Brown that the Advisory Council recommend that the National Public Speaking rules be amended by adding "A member representing a State association may participate in the Regional contest only once and the next Regional contest following the State contest"; motion seconded by Mr. Hilton and carried.

It was moved by Mr. Clements that the Advisory Council authorize the Adviser to write the State Adviser from Missouri that the Council interprets the Constitution to the effect that the proposed candidate will not be an active member of the F.F.A. at the time of the next national convention.

It was moved by Mr. Hilton that the Advisory Council recommend to the Board of Trustees of the F.F.A. that a committee be set up to start the F.F.A. magazine by the F.F.A. and that sufficient funds be budgeted to edit the magazine.
