Subject: Peer Review

- * Peer review shall be voluntary.
- +++ This makes sense, you can't force a person to do a peer review, but they might not get P&T without it.
- * Peer review is critical for P&T candidates seeking promotion with primary emphasis in teaching as part of the IUPUI evaluation process.
- +++ Faculty should be aware that the Peer Review is at the top of the list for the teaching area. It is a part of the point system.
- * Peer review provides another measure of teaching performance augmenting student evaluation.
- +++ a peer review would complement and contrast student evaluations, i.e., one or a few malcontented students in a small class can bias a student evaluation.
- * A peer review policy is needed for E&T.
 - +++ By policy here do we mean guidelines, or restrictions or options?
- * On an experimental basis, FACET shall participate this semester in peer-review for third-year tenure-track candidates.
- +++ FACET is the only choice we really have according to OPD. FACET is a part of OPD, but it is the one connected to actual reportable data about reviews.
- * Peer review should also be available to those that ask for it, with special consideration for first-year, second-year, third-year, and P&T candidates.
- +++ If a new faculty member had a bad peer review his/her first year, a second-year evaluation would be useful since the third year could be too late.

OPD Review

- Totally confidential review, Not a peer review:
- 1. Observation of teaching and then they report to you on what you could work on and what areas they can help with.
- 2. Small group disclosure where the OPD consultant goes to the class and interviews the students until they come up with a consensus about the teacher's good or bad qualities.
- Susan Slaybough from OPD consults with E&T since she has a technical background; and she teaches a CPT course.
- The reports are given only to the individual; they can be included in a dossier if the they so chose.
- OPD reviews are formative.

FACET Review

- The FACET is made up of PEERS. Reviewers are from many schools.
- The OPD people train the FACET people who are actually peers.
