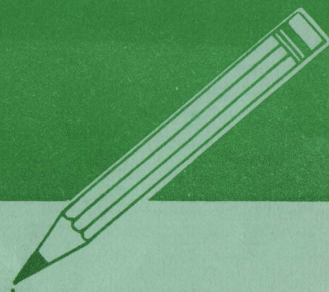

DR. LUKEMEYER APPOINTED

Chancellor Irwin has announced the appointment of Dr. George T. Lukemeyer as acting dean of the School of Medicine. Dr. Lukemeyer, a member of the medical faculty since 1954, has been serving as the school's executive associate dean.

Dr. Irwin also said a search and screen committee is being formed to make recommendations for the permanent appointment of a dean as soon as possible.

Dr. Lukemeyer is nationally recognized in medical education for his leadership in the development of the Indiana Program for Statewide Medical Education, the statewide telecommunications systems in the Medical Education Resources Program, and the school's innovative curriculum.

SEARCHING & SCREENING

A Search and Screen Committee has been named to recommend candidates for a Director of IUPUI Libraries. It is intended that this new position will provide management, guidance, and development for the several IUPUI libraries, with direct responsibility for the libraries on the campuses at Blake Street, 38th Street, Herron School of Art, and School of Physical Education and co-ordinating responsibility for the three professional libraries, so that an effective library system will evolve. The librarian, under the joint direction of the Vice Chancellor/Dean of Faculties and the Dean of University Libraries, will be responsible for planning, development, and co-ordination of policies, procedures, staffs, resources, and facilities of the several libraries to insure effective library operation. He/she will be a member of the administrative staff of the Dean of University Libraries and will maintain liaison and work co-operatively with the directors of other I.U. libraries in establishing system-wide policies. A master's degree from an accredited library school and administrative experience in a major university library are among the qualifications required.
