COMMENCING

More than 3,100 graduates will join the ranks of IUPUI alumni with the university's sixth annual commencement exercises, scheduled for 3 p.m. next Sunday (May 18) at the Indiana Convention-Exposition Center.

Indiana Governor Otis R. Bowen and Indianapolis Mayor Richard G. Lugar will bring greetings from the state and city and Indiana University President John W. Ryan will bestow degrees.

Two honorary degrees will be presented -- to Alberto Arca-Parro, Peruvian proponent of population planning, doctor of law degree, and to Irvine H. Page, researcher on heart and circulation problems, doctor of science degree.

Dr. Arca-Parro, Peru's director of statistics since 1942, acquired his interest in population planning when he was a student in economics at IUB in 1921-23. He was the first chairman of the Population Commission of the United Nations Economic and Social Council and the first president of the Peruvian Center for the Study of Population and Development. He served for 23 years in the Peruvian Congress, organized Peru's first voter registration in 1931 and has been a champion of agrarian reform.

A native of Indianapolis, Dr. Page is director emeritus and senior consultant of the Cleveland Clinic Foundation. His contributions lie in three areas: The study of agents affecting the circulatory system, the pathophysiology of circulatory disease, and neurochemistry. Dr. Page also is a past president of the American Heart Association and the American Society for the Study of Arteriosclerosis.

No tickets are necessary for the program. Guests should use the main entrance, participating graduates should use the west entrance.

Individual schools and divisions will distribute individual diplomas in special programs following the ceremony.

DEDICATE

The Cheer Guild of the Indiana University Hospitals will present a Meditation Room to the hospitals at 10 a.m. Wednesday for use by all Medical Center patients, visitors and personnel.

A collective effort by the guild and its 358 affiliated chapters in the city and state provided the funds for this room near the lobby of University Hospital.

The dedication ceremony will portray the non-sectarian concepts embodied in the total design of this special room which will be reserved for meditation, prayer, inspiration, spiritual renewal and peace.

Conducting the services will be the Rev. John A. Whitesel, director of chaplaincy programs; Rabbi Murray Saltzman; the Rev. George E. Knab, OMI, and Mrs. Harry Clark, Cheer Guild chapel chairman.

Also participating will be Mrs. Laurence F. Haskett, Cheer Guild president; Dr. Steven C. Beering, dean of the School of Medicine, and Robert L. Richards, contractor with the R.E. Wilson Co. The room was designed by William B. Hawkins of Rowland/Hawkins Designers, Inc.

Mrs. Haskett also will dedicate a specially consigned stained-glass window in memory of Anne L. Walker, a two-term Cheer Guild president and active member for 29 years.

A sculpted "tree of life" also is part of the room. A personal gift from Mr. and Mrs. Haskett, it represents the closeness of the Meditation Room to the services of the hospitals.

A reception for the guests will be held after the ceremony in the Krannert Pavilian dining rooms.
