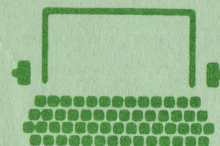

#### HONORS AND ACCOLADES

Ann Marriner, R.N., Ph.D., professor and associate dean for the baccalaureate program at the I.U. School of Nursing, is among the distinguished faculty members presenting seminars at Chautauqua '81, the national program of continuing education for registered nurses to be offered Thursday through July 16 at Vail, Colo.

Professors Clyde Killian and Becky Porter presented a paper last week at a National Physical Therapy Week gathering of more than 3,500 members of the American Physical Therapy Association at its annual conference in Washington, D.C.
