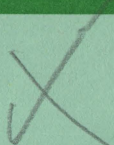
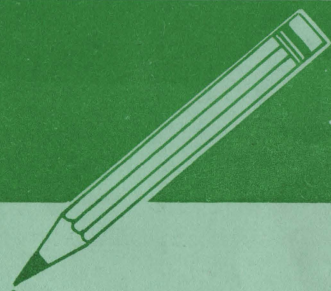

DINNER THEATER COMES TO IUPUI

IUPUI's first dinner theater program will be presented Friday, October 12, in the Union cafeteria. Dinner is at 6:30 p.m. and the popular play, "The Fantasticks," will start at 8:30 p.m.

This play will introduce the dinner theater concept as part of the expanded cultural program for 1973-74 of the IUPUI Lectures and Convocations Committee.

Tickets are \$5 for faculty, staff and the public, and \$3 for IUPUI students. The play, one of the all-time favorites of international audiences, will be given by the Indiana Central Players from Indiana Central College. The Players earlier opened an Indiana Central Dinner-Theater with the same program.

The play concerns young love and the walls that keep the lovers apart. It includes ruses, romantic fantasies, and a look at realities of life as well as dreams. Act I is cast in moonlight, and Act II in sunshine, symbolic of the different views of life parents and children face.

All but one of the original cast which presented this production to Indiana Central audiences will be on the IUPUI stage. Sue Crawford is the girl, Luisa, and Michael Bridgewater is now in the other lead role of the boy, Matt.

The play is directed by Richard A. Williams, and musical director is Elsie Marshall. Technical director is James W. Ream, and choreography is by Rebecca Rutt.

A capacity audience of about 300 is expected.

MEMORIAL SERVICE

A memorial service for Florence R. McMaster, librarian and professor of law at the Indianapolis Law School who died July 16, will be held at 4 p.m. Friday in the East Bay Rotunda of the law library at 735 West New York Street.

Mrs. McMaster served as librarian at the law school and its predecessor Benjamin Harrison Law School for some 25 years. While serving as librarian, she completed her legal education and received her law degree from Indiana University. She was admitted to practice in Indiana, as well as before the United States Supreme Court.

Mrs. McMaster was active in professional librarian organizations and women's groups, such as Altrusa and the Women's Political Caucus.

A "First" -- The Supreme Court of Indiana met for formal oral arguments in a case involving first-degree murder in the Moot Court Room of the Indianapolis Law School on September 18 at 2 p.m. It was the first meeting of the Indiana Supreme Court outside of its chamber ever held in Indianapolis.
