

DESEGREGATION/INTEGRATION STUDY MOSTLY POSITIVE

Copies of the third in a series of studies on the effects of school desegregation/integration on black and white students in Indianapolis and surrounding townships are ready and, while it raises many questions for teachers and school administrators, the findings generally are very positive. For the second year, the report was compiled by people in the School of Education's Center for Urban and Multicultural Education (CUME) and the Office of School Programs at Indianapolis and Bloomington. Researchers include J. John Harris III, professor of educational leadership and policy studies, director of CUME and associate director of the Office of School Programs; Gary M. Ingersoll, associate professor of educational psychology; Camilla A. Heid, CUME assistant director for research and programs, and Richard C. Pugh, profesor of educational psychology and associate dean for research and development. All are with IUPUI and IUB. CUME is in the School of Education, Room 3165. -SAR
