Fiscal Health

The School of Physical Education and Tourism Management continues to be on solid fiscal ground, as it has been since the inception of Responsibility Center Management. Because of inordinate increases in both head count and credit hours in the last fiscal year, there was a net operating balance of \$476,144. The school currently has a tuition reserve of \$255,137, which is more than four times the requirements of the trustees 3% reserve requirement.

In addition to the tuition reserve, we have allocatable resources of \$728,030. These reserves will allow us to internally fund most of our cash initiatives including research support, student recruitment and retention, and technology advances.

Reallocation Plan

The School of Physical Education and Tourism Management has not received any campus reallocation funds in the last three years.
