CAMPUS RESPONDING WELL TO IN-HOUSE CAMPAIGN

The first phase of the IUPUI Campus Campaign is nearly over and the I.U. Foundation has let campaign chairman know that preliminary reports show that, so far, faculty and staff participation is running just over 61 percent, with \$264,445 already raised for programs at IUPUI. Volunteers still are contacting colleagues on campus. "We estimate that nearly half of the solicitations are completed, but some haven't been turned in yet," said Jan Shipps, co-chairman on our campus. The first phase should be over on April 15. The returns so far do not include hospitals, ICFAR, or the schools of Business, Public and Environmental Affairs or Education.


