Commencement for IUPUI is Mother's Day, May 10, 4 p.m. in the Hoosier Dome, where more degrees than ever before will be bestowed in ceremonies presided over for the last time by outgoing President John W. Ryan and the first time by vice president for Indianapolis Gerald A. Bepko. Purdue University President Steven C. Beering will confer 793 Purdue degrees and President Ryan will confer 3,141 I.U. degrees in the 17th annual commencement. Among the nine honorary degrees given by I.U. this year, the two conferred at IUPUI will be given to Dallas W. Sells of Indianapolis, internationally known figure in labor and industry, and to Grayce McVeigh Sills, Columbus, Ohio, noted researcher in psychiatric nursing and chairman and professor of nursing, Dept. of Family and Community, Ohio State University.

All the schools and divisions at IUPUI are planning ceremonies either before or after commencement. For the first time, the School of Law is holding ceremonies before commencement outdoors on the center court of the Sports Center where Indiana Supreme Court Chief Justice Randall T. Shepard will speak. Graduating medical doctors will remain at the dome after commencement where they will take the Hippocratic Oath. The 74th U.S. Army Band will provide music for the thousands of relatives and friends expected to attend. Indiana Governor Robert D. Orr and Mayor of Indianapolis William H. Hudnut III will greet graduates and guests. Degree candidates representing all the graduates from our two universities are David Brewer of I.U. and Jerald Lee Gahimer of Purdue. John A. Ruby will lead the national anthem and "Auld Lang Syne," and Rabbi Sandy Eisenberg Sasso, Congregation Beth-El Zedeck, will give the invocation and benediction. All are welcome to the ceremony.

FLOWERS FOR MOTHER ON HER DAY can be easy this year if you buy them from the Cheer Guild May 6-8 in the lobbies of University and Riley Hospitals. Hanging baskets and flats of many varieties are offered. The sale is from 10 a.m.-5 p.m., and proceeds benefit patients and projects.

SUMMER IS OFFICIAL -- THE CALLIOPE IS ON THE ROAD AGAIN, taking its music to



celebrations around the Mid-west. The colorful circus wagon that houses one of the few remaining steam calliopes was hauled out of its winter home on campus for its first appearance on Apr. 30 at the Kentucky Derby Festival Pegasus Parade in Louisville. And, after a few years' absence, the calliope will appear in the 500 Festival Parade in Indy on May 23. Last year the calliope appeared in 38 events, travelling more than 5,000 miles. Sometimes pulled by teams of horses, more often atop a trailer, the calliope was seen and heard by more than a million people. Player and keeper is Larry MacPherson; crew chief is Kurt Nitsch.
