JOURNALIST RICCHIARDI RETURNING TO CROATIA TO WORK AND REPORT

Sherry Ricchiardi, assistant professor of journalism, has been teaching her students how to cover war, not by the book but by her firsthand experience in covering the bloody civil war in Yugoslavia for two weeks last fall. She is returning Dec. 13 to find relatives who have been displaced in the strife between Croatia and Serbia, to work with the University of Zagreb and do more reporting. Since 1980 Ricchiardi has frequently visited relatives who lived in a peaceful farm area 30 miles from Zagreb Recent fighting has turned the countryside into a battle zone, and Ricchiardi fears for the safety of cousins who she thinks were forced to flee their homes. On her return to the former Yugoslavian republic she plans to continue to cover the human side of the conflict, to interview people in refugee camps and to talk with mothers of both Serbian and Croat soldiers. She will return around Christmas.

METRO MENTORS TEAM UP WITH KIDS

Once a week lately a dozen or so players from the IUPUI men's and women's basketball teams have gone back to grade school where they have captured the attention of little people trying to learn. The IUPUI Metro Mentor Program is a pilot program in its first year and is designed to offer IUPUI athletes the opportunity to be active in the community, help kids and help the university establish ties in inner city schools. So far, so good, says Greg Mingus, a men's basketball associate coach and a PE teacher at the John Hope Elementary School 26, where some of the players invested themselves in talking with students and teaching them the value of education. "You might think it was just the young students who benefitted," he said, "but some of our players are getting more positive attention than they've ever gotten in their lives. It's a wonderful experience for everyone." In their classroom visits the Metros players focus on sportsmanship, cooperation, teamwork, trust and other positive skills. Field trips to such places as the Eli Lilly Center and a game at IUPUI are planned.—Ric Burrous




