PROF. PHILLIPS HONORED AS RETIRING NIDR CHAIRMAN

Prof. Ralph Phillips was honored in a reception and dinner upon his retirement, April 23, as Chairman of the Dental Study Section of the National Institute of Dental Research. He had served on this committee 8 years, and for the last 4 years was its chairman, the longest term anyone had ever served. The committee reviews and awards approximately ten million dollars a year in dental research grants.

FOUNDERS DAY CELEBRATED AT IU

Doctors McDonald, Bogan, Bailey and Johnston attended Indiana University Founders Day ceremonial in Bloomington May 5, commemorating the university's 143rd anniversary. President Stahr announced that gifts and grants to IU in 1964 totaled in excess of 23 million dollars. LIBRARY ORIENTATION GIVEN SECRETARIES
