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What is internationalization?

the process of connecting an institution's teaching, research, and engagement activities to the global networks that frame 21st century life

(connecting outward as well as infusing inward)

Key features of the plan:

- Clear positioning of internationalization as a central force within IU
- Broad conceptualization of internationalization as organic to every discipline and every unit of the university
- Forward-looking emphasis on partnership as a central mechanism of internationalization

Eight Basic Strategies to IU's New Plan

- Expanding enrollment in overseas study programs
- Recruiting highly qualified international students
- Developing the curriculum to build global competency
- Developing strategic partnerships with institutions overseas

Eight strategies (continued):

- Providing opportunities for professional development for faculty (and staff)
- Fostering collaboration across disciplines and campuses
- Expanding international outreach activities with the State of Indiana
- Expanding fundraising and development activities for international activities

IUPUI is already moving forward on all these fronts

- Doubled study abroad numbers and programs in last five years
- Doubled number of international students in last ten,
 reaching all-time high of 1200 this year
- Instituted International Studies major, PUL 5, defined international learning goals, Global Crossroads
- Developed the concept of Strategic Partnerships
- International Development Fund for faculty
- Work closely with ICI, Department of Education, etc.




Total International Student Enrollment by Level

IUPUI International Scholars* 2001-02 to 2006-07


















What has been happening with staff?
