

PSI, PADDLEWHEEL IN ENERGY FORUM HERE

Representatives of Public Service Indiana (PSI) and Paddlewheel Alliance, an anti-nuclear coalition, will participate this week in a "Public Forum on Nuclear Energy" at IUPUI. Sponsored by the IUPUI Student Assembly, the free debate will be held Saturday (July 28) at 2 p.m. in Room 101 of the Lecture Hall.

The public is invited and will have an opportunity to question the speakers after the debate.

PSI will be represented by Frank Clikeman, a specialist in experimental reactor physics and associate professor of nuclear engineering at Purdue University, and Jack Bott, the nuclear licensing manager for PSI.

Paddlewheel Alliance representatives will be Terry Hauser, local chairman of the coal miners' political action committee (District 11 of the United Mine Workers of America), and Mike Olszanski, chairman of the environmental committee (District 13 of the United Steel Workers of America).

Moderator of the debate will be David G. Burns, director of the IUPUI debate program and associate professor of speech-theater-communications. The two groups will address four topics within the broad subject of nuclear energy.

Seating for the forum will be available on a first-come first-served basis.

SPEAKING OF ENERGY. . .

Energy awareness is increasing at IUPUI, according to Ralph K. Bennett, the university's electrical engineer who is fielding suggestions from faculty, staff and students in the Watt Watcher program to reduce electricity usage.

Through the first two weeks of the program, more than 30 suggestions about reducing energy usage were submitted to him. Each suggestion gets a review and investigation as soon as possible.

Faculty, staff and students are invited to do two things to be successful Watt Watchers and help the university reduce its hefty \$18,000 per day electric bill: Turn off and out all lights, air conditioners, fans, and the like as much as possible, and submit ideas on how the university can save by instituting other practical procedures. There is a pot of \$500 in prizes offered to those who submit the best usable suggestions on energy reduction.
