We conduct research in clinical settings, in homes, and in the community. We conduct this research by continually building and constantly redesigning a state-of-the-art discovery infrastructure. IU-CAR is the hub for aging research at Indiana University and our success reflects the investment efforts of Indiana University, the Regenstrief Institute, the Wishard-Eskenzi Health System, Indiana University Health, and other community partners. Our success also reflects the hard work of the dedicated group of creative investigators and support staff within IU-CAR. The team's major effort this year has been building a partnership with the new Center for Medicare and Medicaid Innovation.

In this annual report, we describe our success over the past 16 years






