- [D. Sherman] I feel that we should have a better health care because as students we have the lowest poverty rate, and that at least, uh we need a lower co-pay rate, or free health insurance for students while there undergrad or pursing a graduate degree.
- [A. Hart] The IUPUI women's soccer team defeated Detroit 2 to 1 after going into overtime. This marks their fourth consecutive win.
