

Foreword

This is the thirteenth volume of "Kiwanis Activities" summarizing the officially reported activities of all the Kiwanis clubs in the United States and Canada during the year 1934. The compilation was made possible by utilizing the Official Monthly Reports recording activities as reported by the club secretaries.

At the close of 1934 there were 1,839 clubs, according to the membership records as of December 31, 1934, and nearly all were carrying on civic and welfare programs.

The Objects of Kiwanis International have made possible these numerous achievements recorded in this present book. These Objects are:

To give primacy to the human and spiritual rather than to the material values of life.

To encourage the daily living of the Golden Rule in all human relationships.

To promote the adoption and the application of higher , social business and professional standards.

To develop, by precept and example, a more intelligent, aggressive and serviceable citizenship.

To provide through Kiwanis clubs, a practical means to form enduring friendships, to render altruistic service, and to build better communities.

To co-operate in creating and maintaining that sound public opinion and high idealism which make possible the increase of righteousness, justice, patriotism, and good-will.

Suggestions for Your Own Club

KIWANIS ACTIVITIES is a summary of the community betterment and service activities of Kiwanis clubs in the United States and Canada. The book is compiled annually from the Official Monthly Reports submitted by clubs.

The activities indicate the many varied and practical applications of the ideals, and objectives of Kiwanis International, and suggest opportunities of similar service for other communities, institutions, groups and individuals.

The book is not an honor-roll of clubs. It has been compiled as a descriptive presentation of diversified service endeavors.

How to Use the Book

KIWANIS ACTIVITIES is suggestive of what can be done in all communities by active clubs. Every club, large or small, seeking suggestions for community service can find in this volume sources of information on every conceivable kind of activity.

The key which unlocks the treasure of this book for clubs is the index on the final pages. There appear over forty general divisions of activities, which direct the reader to pages of thousands of records of actual club work.

Clubs which have made surveys of their own communities and are planning new or additional service activities, can review the results of clubs in towns of somewhat the same type and population. Clubs seeking suggestions may be located in either agricultural or industrial areas, or in vicinities of both farming and manufacturing.

For a club in an agricultural region, the index will indicate hundreds of valuable activities in better town and country relations work, in city beautiful planning, health campaigns, conservation and general education. If a club functions in a community where all forms of general economic enterprise are in operation, a vast store-house of material is suggested by such index topics as health and sanitation, boys' and girls' work, improvement of civic conditions, aid to business and industry, and many others.

A careful study of KIWANIS ACTIVITIES by members will reveal to them many clubs of about the same size, in localities having similar opportunities and problems, engaged in active and varied service programs.

Every Kiwanian is urged to make a thorough inspection of KIWANIS ACTIVITIES to familiarize himself with the summary of service work of all the clubs in Kiwanis International.

THE UNDER-PRIVILEGED CHILD

The service rendered by all the Kiwanis clubs in the United States and Canada, on behalf of under-privileged children, consists in removing those physical, mental, moral and economic handicaps, which bar them from the full measure of citizenship.

The following shows the various kinds of activities accomplished during

1934 to aid the children under this major Kiwanis objective:

Physical

Albany, Ga. Our clinic continued to operate, treating dental corrections and physical ailments. Clothing and shoes are supplied, and milk is furnished for school children.

Albuquerque, N. M. Funds were available to purchase serums for inoculating 2,000 school children against diphtheria.

Alexandria, Minn. Following a fatal case of diphtheria, over 1,000 cultures were taken among school children, and we received permission from parents for a vaccination campaign against the disease.

Alhambra, Calif. A survey was made to find all crippled children in this area so they could receive help. We supply free medical service, bread, and milk to under-privileged cases.

Anaheim, Calif. Kiwanis established a dental clinic in the schools, and fur-

nishes free eye examinations and glasses.

Ann Arbor, Mich. The club finances supervised recreation for children at a hospital, and provides lunches for under-privileged youngsters attending a nursery school. A substantial budget cares for boys and girls work activities.

Appleton, Wis. The club paid hospital and doctor bills for under-privileged

children, and furnishes milk for the needy.

Arkansas City, Kan. An open air school for tubercular youngsters and free dental and medical service are the club's activities.

Asheville, N. C. Our baseball league, with 14 commercial teams, secures funds for our under-privileged child work.

Ashland, Ky. Thousands of free meals are available for youngsters, and the Ashland, Ky. Thousands of free meals are available for youngsters, and the club buys milk for under-nourished babies. An appropriation was also made to buy shoes for needy school children. Medical attention is available for those not having money to pay for it.

Ashland, Va. Under-nourished children were supplied food and milk, and a

clinic was organized to immunize children against diphtheria.

Astoria, Ore. During the winter, some 500 families received salmon liver oil with potent Vitamin A content and this was distributed by physicians, dentists and the Red Cross. A pamphlet on "Essentials of Child Welfare" was published for local distribution.

Atlanta, Ga. The major objective of the club is continued work at the Hill-

side Cottages. Clothing, shoes, and other necessities are provided unfor-

tunate boys and girls.

Atlantic City, N. J. Health examinations and general assistance are given to

under-privileged youngsters.

Augusta, Ga. A monthly donation is given to a children's hospital for under-privileged child work. A fund makes it possible to purchase books for under-privileged youngsters.

Bartow, Fla. Assistance was given for sponsoring a nutritional camp. The club has several unfortunate youths who are receiving medical attention and educational aid. Milk and fruit are provided young people.

Baton Rouge, La. Endorsed a movement to establish a state school for deaf

negroes and a general program is in operation for helping under-privileged and destitute children.

Beaver Dam, Wis. Kiwanis aid to under-privileged children makes it possible for all children entering school to have free vaccinations.

Beckley, W. Va. Hospitalization is provided for all under-privileged youngsters who need medical attention because of disease or accidents. Glasses are furnished poor children.

Bloomington, Ill. The club operates a health camp and purchases necessities for the poor.

Blue Ridge, Ga. Sponsored a tubercular clinic and bought books for underprivileged children. Bowling Green, Ky. Ninety-two crippled children were treated at a clinic,

and the club purchased shoes, braces, and milk for the youngsters. One youngster is provided transportation to and from school.

Brockton, Mass. The club observed Child Health Day and sent children afflicted with incipient tuberculosis to a health camp. The children's play day attracted 5,000 youngsters in June.

Brownsville, Tex. A child was sent to Galveston for a serious operation.

Our minstrel show gave us money for under-privileged child work. Burlingame-San Mateo, Calif. Equipment was purchased for the dental clinic of the elementary schools, and we furnished hundreds of meals for school

Burlington, Iowa. During 1934 the club spent over \$1,500.00 for providing milk to public and parochial schools. The 11th annual minstrel show provided the necessary funds for all under-privileged child activities.

Burlington, N. C. A day nursery was started so working mothers could leave their children in this institution during the day.

Cairo, Ill. A special committee was appointed to meet with the local school board in completing arrangements for the children of 600 families on relief to secure books and other necessities. The cost of this activity was \$2,000.00. Food was furnished a children's home.

Caldwell, Idaho. A young girl afflicted with a serious brain disease was sent

to Seattle for an operation.

Calgary, Alta. Kiwanians were responsible for collecting a fund of \$4,500.00 for the Woods Christian Orphan Home. We received net proceeds of approximately \$2,000.00 from an antique exhibition which was the largest ever held in western Canada. This money was divided between two local orphanages.

Cambridge, Ohio. The club equipped a Kiwanis room for under-privileged children at a local hospital. An opportunity school for subnormal children is now in the third year of its operation. The club has bought general equipment, tools and new machinery for this undertaking.

Capitol Hill, Oklahoma City, Okla. The club made it possible for over 100

tonsil operations to be performed without charge.

Charlottesville, Va. Several thousand visits were made to our clinic where medical services were available to children and adults. An automobile is furnished to assist in the clinic work and home demonstrations.

Chickasha, Okla. Through the efforts of Kiwanis, over 1,000 children of the

county were given dental examinations and medical attention.

Clarksburg, W. Va. The Committee on Under-Privileged Child is working with county officials for assisting delinquent and needy children.

Cleveland, Ohio. The club finances a Kiwanis Nursery School for crippled children at the Rainbow Hospital. Glasses are supplied to under-priv-

ileged children.

College Park, Detroit, Mich. Forty children were sent to a Salvation Army camp and we purchased necessities and home furnishings for unfortunates. The club assumed the publication of the Highland Park Progress, a community newspaper. The proceeds in this endeavor will be used for under-privileged child activities. Free dental care was available for children.

Compton, Calif. Charity work is constantly going on by Kiwanis doctors and dentists for over 100 indigent patients. Shoes, clothing, and other neces-

sities are also available for the poor.

Corpus Christi, Tex. A Mexican youth, who is handicapped because he is crippled, was given money to buy art materials. The home in which he lives was wired for electric lights so he might have an opportunity to work at night. Children needing medical attention were given club help.

Council Bluffs, Iowa. Children in the public schools, whose parents were unable to pay for diphtheria antitoxin, were immunized free of charge.

Covington, Va. Club paid \$600.00 for surgical attention to under-privileged children.

as, Tex. The club continues to operate a news boys' camp and through subscriptions we received over \$1,400.00 for our dental clinic. Dallas, Tex.

Daytona Beach, Fla. Medicine, milk and food are available to the children in the schools. A Thrift House collects clothing for distribution among the poor. Local doctors, dentists and nurses assist in giving their services to school children.

Denison, Iowa. During the county 4-H fair, the club sponsored a health clinic. Milk and hot lunches are provided for under-privileged young-

sters in the schools.

Dubuque, Iowa. Several youths born deaf and dumb were placed in an institution for training.

East Orange, N. J. A free bed is sponsored in an orthopedic hospital and all youngsters from an orphanage are given automobile rides and entertain-

ment. Boys and girls were sent to a camp for a summer vacation.

Elgin, Ill. During the past two years, nearly \$5,000.00 was spent for medical assistance to needy children in the schools. Glasses are provided free of

charge for youngsters.

El Paso, Tex. Under-nourished school children are provided with hot meals and milk is supplied to the under-privileged. General medical attention and a health camp are other activities of the club.

Emporia, Kan. A pre-school clinic was sponsored by Kiwanis. This cared for health examinations, mental tests, and conferences with parents.

Favetteville, N. C. Orthopedic and better baby clinics are held weekly. Milk

is purchased for under-nourished school children.

Forest Park, Ill. Over 300 under-privileged children were immunized against typhoid fever and diphtheria. Two children, one crippled and the other deaf and dumb, are being sent to special schools in Chicago. Unfortunate families are being given assistance and the annual minstrel show provided funds for our welfare activities.

Fort Worth, Tex. Service was given to 500 children who could not attend

school before receiving medical help.

Fremont, Ohio. Kiwanis physicians assisted in the establishment of special school classes for the hard of hearing and those suffering with eye defects. Free dental service is available to school children who come from homes of the poor.

Galion, Ohio. The club's major project, that of repairing and adding an additional wing to the Children's Home, was realized in August when

over 500 people attended the rededication of this institution.

Geneva, Ohio. The club conducts a fresh air camp and preventorium each year, and a pre-school clinic for general health work. This year the club purchased the land on which its preventorium is built. This property was formerly leased. Hot lunches were supplied to the needy in the schools.

Great Falls, Mont. Physical tests for tuberculosis, tonsils, eye defects, and general health measures is the program of our under-privileged child

undertaking. Glasses are supplied to the children who need them.

Greenville, S. C. Over 2,000 children were immunized in an anti-diphtheria campaign. The result of this campaign was 3,000 other patients becoming inoculated. Tuberculosis tests are made at free clinics to which the club gives funds. Milk, cod liver oil, and food are supplied the needy. Children were sent to a summer camp.

Hamilton, Ohio. The club found a permanent home for a two-weeks-old baby, and arrangements were made to send a blind child to a special school at Boston. A children's clinic for eye, ear, nose and throat ex-

aminations is conducted during the year.

Hampton, Va. Monthly clinics to care for orthopedic and health cases have treated hundreds of under-privileged children. Over \$1,000.00 was spent during the first six months of 1934 for this work.

Hanford, Calif. Crippled children are cared for at a clinic conducted at the

county hospital.

Harrisburg, Pa. Over 5,000 children attended our Thanksgiving party, and for eight years the club has been helping Miss Ruth Keller who is now in college. Children are sent to a camp which was erected at a cost of over \$8,000.00. Orthopedic work is a constant activity of the club.

Hickory, N. C. Children of the county are sent to a preventorium where they receive medical attention, health diets, sunshine, and supervised recreation. Lunches are provided needy school children.

Holyoke, Mass. A youngster is being sent to the Randolph School for the Deaf and Dumb.

Homestead, Pa. The well baby clinic cared for hundreds of cases during 1934. Health examinations, eye tests and glasses were given free to the needy.

Hopewell, Va. During 1934 the memorial clinic treated 290 cases with many receiving hospitalization.

Hutchinson, Kan. Two children were sent to a state institution for tuber-culosis treatment, and hundreds of quarts of milk were dispensed each month for under-nourished children.

Irvine-Ravenna, Ky. A Kiwanis clinic cared for the needs of crippled children. Local doctors assisted in tonsil operations, and it was found

that 17 per cent of the children in the community needed dental attention. Issaquah, Wash. A health round-up for all children of school age whose

parents are on relief was conducted in July.

Jacksonville, Fla. Clothing, milk and glasses are available for the needy. The baby welfare project makes it possible for families to receive visits from nurses, baby specialists, and secure food and medicine. Under the foster-parent plan, birthday presents and entertainment are given children. Glasses, orthopedic appliances, and other necessities are provided

free to children.

Janesville. Wis. Our annual show gave us \$2,255.00 for under-privileged child work. Health examinations and hospitalization are available. Fourteen years ago, the club handled its first special child case. Conditions necessitated treatments until just three years ago, but the man is now

gainfully employed. Attention is given to poor families where handicaps might be harmful to growing children.

Jasper, Ala. The annual clinic prepared for 150 operations. The medical staff was made up of doctors and nurses throughout the county. Children spent six hours each day in the under-privileged child nursery which provides breakfasts, baths, sleep periods, and supervised play. Six nurses and teachers are employed in this activity.

Kansas City, Mo. The Kiwanis Child Health Center was operated during the year 1934 with 920 babies examined, 3,000 home visits by nurses, and over 170 new families contacted. An 11-year-old girl was admitted to the Mercy hospital and the club supplied clothing for indigent children. Kingsport, Tenn. The Committee on Under-Privileged Child has begun a project for building portable porches on to the homes of poor families where children have tuberculosis. Each porch costs approximately \$30.00.

Klamath Falls, Ore. Hundreds of school children were furnished hot lunches throughout 1934. Milk, glasses, clothing and medical attention were provided a number of children. Funds for this work were received through a series of radio broadcasts.

La Habra, Calif. Two dentists of the club examined the teeth of nearly 900

grammar school children and gave free dental work to 190 cases.

Lake View, Chicago. Through the efforts of the Under-Privileged Child Committee, the manual training department at the Jahn School was reestablished. This allowed for the club's activities in cabinet making, mechanical drawing, book binding, etc. Free dental service, glasses, and orthopedic applicances were purchased for children. School facilities are available for crippled children. The boys patrol was furnished raincoats, beta and belte. hats and belts.

Las Vegas, N. M. A free clinic for school children is operated every Saturday morning. Several hundred tonsillectomies were financed by the club and much free dental work is also done. A crippled child was sent to a

Shrine clinic at Albuquerque.

Lawrence, Kan. rrence, Kan. In nine years there have been over 4,000 patients in attendance at our various clinics. The orthopedic clinic handled 352 cases during 1934. The mental hygiene clinic has given service to over 1,000 patients since 1924, and is in charge of a psychiatrist. Nurses and secretarial help are provided by the club for the doctors. The orthopedic clinic has been operated by the club for over 10 years and supplies braces, casts, and other equipment for children. A well baby clinic also cares

for many cases. Los Angeles, Calif. Angeles, Calif. The club's major objective is the McKinley Home. Physical examinations are available for every boy. A competent supervisor is employed for recreation at the Sunset Community Center, a recreational hall for under-privileged boys and girls. Kiwanis doctors, dentists and optometrists give their services for helping all youngsters. Public forums help us secure funds for our boys and girls work.

club plans entertainment for all the children.

Lubbock, Tex. The club sponsored the first corrective speech clinic in Texas and a great deal of good is being accomplished.

Marlboro, Mass. A clinic to correct defects in speech, particularly among the school children, has been started. It is planned to have others attend special classes.

Matoaka, W. Va. The Under-Privileged Child Committee has a campaign for inoculating all school children against small pox and typhoid fever.

McMinnville, Ore. A county-wide general and tuberculosis clinic started during 1934. All physicians, dentists, and nurses participate in this activity. Charts are now designed to include case histories during each child's 12 years in the schools.

Middlesboro, Ky. Nutritional classes were organized in the schools to help pupils who are under-weight and under-nourished, and a drive for \$2,000.00 for an orphanage was started in June. A children's clinic provided free service for tonsil operations and the fitting of glasses.

Milwaukee, Wis. Orthopedic appliances are supplied crippled children, and the club furnished a Kiwanis cottage at Army Lake with beds, mattresses, etc., at a cost of \$650.00. A radio was presented to a school for

crippled children.

Monett, Mo. Hospitalization is available for all crippled and blind children. Rural school children were vaccinated. Three children were taken to the Missouri School for the Blind at St. Louis. Other children were taken to Kansas City and St. Louis to receive skilled medical attention.

Monroe, Ga. A building was rented by the club for a nursery school to care for 50 children between the ages of two and five years. A fund makes it possible to furnish milk for under-privileged children.
 Monroe, Wash. A free clinic is conducted for school children, where all with physical and mental handicaps are given attention. Clothing and glasses

are supplied the needy.

Montreal, P. Q. The Montreal Children's hospital was given \$1,481.91 which was received from a benefit hockey match. The sewing club completed over 1,000 articles of wearing apparel for crippled children. During the year members helped to transport children to the cripple clinic. Food, milk, home furnishings, a piano, athletic equipment, and toys were furnished for the children of various orphanages and institutions in Montreal. During the year there was entertainment, motion pictures and picnics for all the children. There were over 80,000 meals served during 1934 with the estimated retail value of the food stuffs over \$1,500.00. Three Kiwanians are directors in the local Society for Crippled Children.

New Albany, Miss. Lunches were provided for the children in the primary schools who were under-nourished, and the club continues its support, sending a blind boy to college and another youth to a county school.

Several children were given hospitalization free of charge.

Newnan, Ga. Kiwanis conducted a tuberculosis clinic, dispensed diphtheria antitoxin, furnished school books to children, purchased orthopedic appliances, and conducted a summer camp.

New Philadelphia, Ohio. A portion of a small estate was given to Kiwanis for under-privileged child work.

Newport News, Va. Monthly clinics were held during 1934 with an average attendance of over 40 each 30-day period.

Newton, Mass. The child of a former Kiwanian, who died and left the youngster destitute, is receiving help. One youngster afflicted with infantile paralysis is receiving medical care.

New Westminster, B. C. Clothing, shoes, milk, medical and dental service, eye glasses, and assistance to the deaf and dumb and blind children was the work of the club during 1934. The second annual Kiwanis exhibition and hobby show included classifications in commercial, educational. industrial and hobby divisions.

Norton, Va. Our clinic is caring for more than 200 children in the county who have been given tonsil operations and other medical help. The clinic

also cares for tuberculosis cases.

Oklahoma City, Okla. A survey among 450 school children started a health drive to correct physical ailments and disease. Thirteen professional members of the club give their services free in treating tonsil, eye, ear, nose, throat and teeth cases. Physical examinations were given all the children in various schools. Boys were sent to a summer camp and 500 orphans of the county were taken on a picnic.

Olmsted Falls. Ohio. Our campaign makes it possible so no child in the

local schools shall suffer from optical or dental defects.

Omak, Wash. Thousands of meals were furnished to needy school children.

Ottawa, Ont. A Kiwanis carnival was very successful. Prizes included several automobiles, a 10-day trip to Bermuda, a provincial government bond, and 32 other prizes. Children from local orphanages and the public schools were entertained during the summer.

Pampa, Tex. The club pays for all medical attention for under-privileged

children.

Petersburg, Va. During 1934 there were over 1,000 individuals given health examinations and care at our clinic. The health nurse made 3,444 home visits. The club furnishes casts, braces, tractions, high sole and other shoes, glasses, clothing, milk, drugs, etc., for those in need. One patient has been started in vocational training.

Philadelphia, Pa. For the 11th year, the Kiwanis Happiness Car visited the charitable institutions, recreational centers and playgrounds to give entertainment and instruction. Medical attention was available for children

in distress.

Phoenix, Ariz. Legislation was prepared for the establishment of a state school for feeble minded children, and also to take out of politics the superintendency of two industrial schools. Kiwanians also worked with school authorities for securing an institution for tubercular children. Milk and lunches were furnished under-nourished children. Over \$1,000.00 was realized from a post-season football game which was witnessed by over 7,000 fans. All orthopedic cases are receiving hospitalization and over \$1,000.00 was spent during the first half of the year on 34 needy We saved the life of one child who would have died from pneumonia in a few hours had it not been for the club's assistance.

Pittsburgh, Pa. Eye glasses, orthopedic appliances, surgical and medical assistance, dental care, and assistance to under-nourished children was

the program of the club in 1934.

Plymouth, Mich. The club sees to it that all under-nourished children are placed under the supervision of an experienced dietician. Charitable cases

are given attention.

Port Arthur-Fort William, Ont. Many crippled children's cases were investigated and all who needed hospitalization were offered Kiwanis help. A series of radio broadcasts explained the prevention of tuberculosis, infantile paralysis, rickets, street accidents and other causes for the crippling of children. On recommendation of school nurses, poor children are provided glasses and crippled children are given orthopedic appliances. Child welfare and clinic work was conducted during the entire

Pullman, Wash. Children from the homes of the unemployed are furnished transportation so they might be admitted to the F. E. R. A. nursery school. Part of the expenses are paid for employing a school nurse.

Quebec, P. Q. Our annual frolics gave us \$2,000.00 for crippled children's work. All youngsters are taken to the clinic at Jeffrey Hale hospital.

Glasses and other necessities are provided needy children.

Ravenswood, Chicago. A boy showing definite anti-social tendencies was placed in an institution for discipline and training. Three children were placed for adoption in desirable homes, and we purchased books, Y. M. C. A. memberships, fruit, vegetables, glasses, and gave dental and medical care to under-nourished children. Kiwanians are constantly working in the schools with the children to guide their recreational interests and make home visitations to find out about their environment.

Ridgefield Park-Teaneck, N. J. The club continues a free clinic with dental and medical attention for those who need it. Hundreds of magazines were sent to the children's ward at the county hospital, and continued

supervision is given for aiding a blind youth.

Rochester, N. Y. The Kiwanis Joy Car, during 1934, served 25 institutions. It gave many children and adults trips and outings. This activity with

the automobile has been going on for over 10 years.

Rocky Mount, N. C. The club makes it possible for serving over 18,000 meals to under-privileged children each school year. A fund of over \$1,000.00 cares for tuberculosis cases.

Salina, Kan. The club is sponsoring 16 crippled children who are receiving treatment at local hospitals and in a Wichita institution. Glasses and shoes are provided for under-privileged youngsters. Twenty-five special cases were given Kiwanis attention during 60 days, and a number of

these were given hospitalization.

Salt Lake City, Utah. We have 150 under-privileged children who are receiving medical attention and hospitalization. Scholarships are available

for needy boys and girls, and physical, mental and moral training is available under the guidance of experts.

Saranac Lake, N. Y. Cooperation is given for conducting a pre-natal clinic,

and children were sent to a summer camp.

Seaford, Del. Twenty-five children were provided glasses. Kiwanian E. R. Mayerberg, of Wilmington, assisted the club in this work. Kiwanians traveled over 1,700 miles to have these children given examinations.

Smithfield, N. C. A merchants' exposition and automobile show gave us the necessary funds to carry on our under-privileged child work in the county. Medical attention and milk is available for the needy.

South Tacoma, Wash. Four hundred rural school children were given health examinations. Entertainment was available for all the children in local

institutions.

Staunton, Va. Under-privileged children are treated at a dental clinic. The club has contributed to the health and happiness of 3,340 children in this

vicinity.

Tacoma, Wash. All cases needing hospitalization are taken to the Kiwanis clinic at the Tacoma General Hospital. We purchased milk, cod liver oil, shoes, stockings, and clothing for under-privileged children.

Tallahassee, Fla. Summer camp privileges for 40 youths, a donation to the

Children's Home Society, the supplying of milk for under-privileged children, and a tonsil clinic was the work of the club in 1934.

Thomaston, Ga. Three hundred children were given health examinations before the opening of school. Forty youngsters underwent tonsil and

adenoid operations.

Toronto, Ohio. Over 3,000 attended a fair which had 30 booths in which were displays from local stores and industries. This gave us funds to

carry on under-privileged child work.

Tucson, Ariz. Kiwanis gives its support for the preventorium where children with tuberculosis are helped. Books and magazines were sent to a boys' industrial school at Fort Grant, and we supplied milk, groceries, clothing, Y. M. C. A. memberships, and hospital treatment for children. A scholarship is also available for worthy youths.

University City, Mo. Over 4,000 children were given dental examinations and parents notified as to the necessary care needed. Free dental service was available for poor children. Visits were made to hospitals to contest the charity children and free house was available.

tact charity children and free showers were available to 400 under-priv-

ileged children during the summer months.

Washington, D. C. The club assisted in planning the 1935 convention for the International Society for Crippled Children. During the entire year of 1934, the Kiwanis clinic was held every Friday at the Children's Hospital with Dr. Curtis Lee Hall in charge. Several hundred children were given attention. Hospitalization, nursing care, and orthopedic equipment were supplied. Funds were also provided for a summer camp for needy children and their mothers. Home visits were made by the In-

structive Visiting Nurses Society.

Watertown, N. Y. Over 100 children received hot lunches every noontime during the school year. A fund was started so milk could be distributed by the Visiting Nurses Association. The boys and girls of various institutions and orphanages were given entertainments.

Waterville, Me. Kiwanians give personal assistance to children who have been judged worthy and in need of care. A group of youngsters were sent to the Salvation Army camp for two weeks' vacation. Medical and

dental attention and glasses were available for the needy.

Welch, W. Va. The club supplied books, clothing, hot lunches, and milk for rural and local grade school children. In July, over 1,200 children enjoyed a picnic. Teachers assisted in investigating cases that need Kiwanis help. One child with a severe eye disorder was given prompt attention. The greatest of all religious dramas, the Passion Play, was sponsored by the club for the benefit of its under-privileged child fund.

West Bend, Wis. A child health survey was started in the county under a federal program to give work to unemployed nurses.

Westfield, Mass. Crippled children were taken to the Shrine Hospital in Springfield for treatment, and the club gave clothing and toys to nearly

900 children.

West Palm Beach, Fla. The club continues to operate its three clinics, the medical and surgical, the eye, ear, nose and throat, and the dental clinic. The medical and surgical clinic cared for 398 cases. There was a total expenditure of \$1,361.77. The eye, ear, nose and throat clinic had a total of 476 cases, and furnished glasses free of charge. There was a total expenditure of \$983.89. The dental clinic had 1,212 cases, with a total expenditure of \$3,319.38. This clinic employs a full time dentist, one hygienist and a part-time nurse, all employed and paid by the club. The county nurse made 759 home visits, 157 school visits, and held 591 conferences. Pupils were immunized against diphtheria, typhoid fever and small pox. The total expenditure was \$787.91. An emergency ward cares for accident cases of school children. The Good Samaritan and the Pine Ridge hospitals cooperate with the club in all its work. The ninth annual under-privileged child benefit show in February gave the club its funds for all its under-privileged child endeavors. A summer camp

was open for boys and girls. West Park, Cleveland, Ohio. The club has plans to give special training in art, music, and other educational endeavors to crippled children. The Children's Aid Society was given a donation to buy necessary equipment

for these children.

Winamac, Ind. Local doctors gave their cooperation for immunizing 3,000 children against diphtheria. Medical and dental service is available for under-privileged children and we supply glasses for the needy.

Woodbury, N. J. During the past five years, over 1,000 operations for children were sponsored by the Kiwanis club.

Worcester, Mass. The food and fashion show was attended by 11,000 people and gave us proceeds of \$1,000.00 for our under-privileged child work. During 1934, the scoliosis clinic at the Memorial hospital had a budget of \$2,000.00. The club has spent \$20,000.00 on this clinic in the past 10 years.

Kalamazoo, Mich. A budget of \$6,000.00 was used to provide a summer home for under-privileged boys and girls at Pretty Lake Vacation Camp.

Shoes and rubbers are purchased for youngsters.

Kitchener-Waterloo, Ont. Four hundred boys and girls enjoyed a camp

holiday.

Lewistown, Mont. Our annual health camp for under-nourished children was a success. Children from all parts of the state came to this camp in charge of trained supervisors and instructors. Nine hundred school children attended our minstrel show matinee.

Nashville, Tenn. Several hundred children received the benefits of the John W. Thomas fresh air camp. Wearing apparel was provided all the youngsters. An inter-city boxing match gave us \$1,090.00 for our work.

Norfolk, Va. Camp Kiwanis was built and equipped at a cost of \$4,250.00.

The camp, which is on the shores of Chesapeake Bay, accommodated 88 children in 1934. Since the club was organized it has given over \$40,000.00 to charitable institutions.

Peterborough, Ont. Two hundred children were examined in preparation for the summer health camp activities. Over \$1,100.00 was spent in providing food, clothing, transportation and supervision for 194 children who

attended the camp.

Pittsfield, Mass. The club operated the Kiwanis health camp for the seventh year. An average gain in weight per child was three and one-half pounds. There were 52 children attending. There were 200 applicants, but many of these were given hospitalization.

- 1934. The camp is supervised by trained leaders and dieticians. Sarasota, Fla. The Kiwanis health camp and the Boy Scout camp are two activities which provide health programs for under-nourished children.
- kane, Wash. Seventy-one under-nourished boys and girls from the Pensioned Mothers' Homes attended the Kiwanis health Center. The aver-Spokane, Wash. age gain in weight per child was over five pounds. Doctors determined the children who most needed this camp recreation. Free medical, surgical and optical examinations were given all the children. Club doctors made weekly visits to inspect the camp. Voluntary subscriptions of \$2,168.00 were pledged for this activity.
- Springfield, Mass. During the summer months, 126 boys and girls enjoyed camp life. There were 972 children immunized against diphtheria at a clinic. The club carried on child welfare and emergency work among needy families at a cost of \$2,800.00 during 1934.

The accomplishments in furthering the development of better town and country relations, during 1934, shows varied activities of real value. The results for the past year were as follows:

General

Albuquerque, N. M. All food produced locally was served at one of our dinners. Speakers at the occasion were the county agent and the state dairy inspector. This dinner was an effort to stress the importance of consuming home-grown products.

Alexandria, Minn. The club arranged for an open forum discussion for the public to hear the proposals of the A. A. A. We entertained all

the members of the Future Farmers of America.

Amarillo, Tex. We had nearly 200 guests at our annual farmers' day program. Funds were available for the purchase of pigs for a boys' club.

Americus, Ga. Assistance was secured from the Federal Government in a land terracing program to prevent soil erosion, and gave assistance in

securing a canning plant.

- Bangor, Pa. Farmers and their wives invited Kiwanians and their families to a banquet at a nearby community center. There were 205 in atendance and every Kiwanian was given a prize consisting of baskets of fruit, vegetables, chickens and ducks. In April we entertained all the rural folks.
- Bend, Ore. The program has got under way to encourage increased clover seed growing, which is one of the leading farm products of the country. The county agent keeps the club in close touch with farm problems and the condition of crops.

Billings, Mont. We helped to establish a community market for the Billings Fruit and Vegetable Growers' Association. Help was given an organ-

ization which works among needy people in the rural districts.

Bradford, Ill. We sponsored a corn show and farmers' institute, both were successful, and a horse show drew an attendance of several thousand

people.

Brookhaven, Miss. The Club Committee on Agriculture is taking a lead in combating the problems of the dairy industry which is one of the major industries in this locality. Our efforts are also directed toward promoting diversified farming. The club took an active part in directing the county fair which is a great help in developing better rural life. We led a successful fight in defending Mississippi dairymen from being discredited on the New Orleans market. A large city and country picnic was held in July.

Butte, Mont. During the year over 500 rural people visited with us in com-

munities outside of Butte.

Cairo, Ill. Through the efforts of the Committee on Agriculture an association of various business and civic groups was formed to build a better relationship between the urban and rural communities in southern Illinois, southeastern Missouri, and western Kentucky. Many people came to our city to visit the 4-H club exhibits of stock, poultry, sewing, etc. We held a meeting with the representatives of the farm bureau, and a

Kiwanis banquet was attended by the farmers in this territory.

Caldwell, Idaho. Meetings with rural groups were held during the year and Kiwanis was active in developing a cooperative live stock and meat packing plant. Assistance was also given in securing more water for

the irrigation districts which were in cultivation.

Campbell, Calif. We continued our activities for furthering the interests of the prune industry and members of the Public Affairs Committee worked for several weeks in development of a prune pool.

Carey, Ohio. A farmers' community club, originally started and sponsored by Kiwanis, is now a successful organization with many members.

Cedartown, Ga. We secured the signature of farmers for a cotton acreage reduction plan, and agreed to underwrite the cost of the equipment in a soil erosion program. Representative farmers of this locality were our guests.

Chisholm, Minn. The Club Committee on Public Affairs is active in getting better telephone service for the rural community and also to procure a more suitable site for a farmers' market. The club is also interested in general 4-H club work.

Circleville, Ohio. During the pumpkin show, the club gave first, second and

third prizes for the best decorated windows and store fronts.

Clatskanie, Ore. Secured an experimental canning unit to care for surplus products; assisted in planning a community fair; held a free auction for the benefit of the farming communities; attended farm gatherings; and secured additional acreage for the growing of late peas for the eastern market.

Compton, Calif. Over 3,300 women from Compton and the rural districts

attended a cooking and demonstration school.

Concordia, Kan. Farmers in all the surrounding communities were given information as to how to combat the bind weed which is a very serious menace to agriculture. County-wide meetings were held for the purpose of educating people as to the methods of control of this weed, and as a result of our activities, the county has purchased machinery and spraying material. Club support was given to make the 4-H fair a success. Connellsville, Pa. The 10th annual farm-city dinner was held in April.

Conway, Ark. Night classes were conducted for adult farmers in six communities of the county in the interest of seeking cooperation for a vocational agriculture program. The club gave a cash prize for the winner in a public speaking contest held by the Future Farmers of America.

Davenport, Iowa. The club sponsored the Iowa corn husking contest with an attendance of over 10,000 people. The excellent work of the 4-H clubs, which has Kiwanis sponsorship, has helped a great deal during the drought period. Several 4-H boys were sent to the International Livestock Show at Chicago.

Deer Lodge, Mont. To assist farmers, Kiwanians helped in the formation of a Production Credit Association which directs community loans. Kiwanis also sponsored a campaign for the destruction of gophers and grasshoppers. We traveled over 400 miles on a good-will tour, visiting 100 ranches in the county. Over 2,000 farmers took part in our picnic and barbecue.

Dothan, Ala. A farmers' institute was a success, and the Committee on Agriculture is developing a program for better livestock in the county.

A trophy was awarded for the best 4-H club work.

Edmonton, Alta. Several thousand magazines and books were distributed among farm families, and funds were available for rural boys and girls to buy pure-bred Yorkshire gilts.

El Paso, Tex. The club again sponsored the hog division of the Southwest Livestock and Agricultural Show and gave \$300.00 in prizes.

Eufaula, Ala. A curb market, started nine years ago, again completed a very successful season for the farmers in this section. An agricultural

fair was sponsored by the club.

Freeport. Ill. Over 4,000 people attended our second annual corn husking contest. There were so many entrants that we were compelled to hold elimination contests. In the final battle, there were 10 contestants. A silver cup was awarded the winner of the greatest number of points in the show of the Rabbit Breeders' Association.

Fullerton, Calif. A float was entered in the orange festival parade, and 30 farmers attended one of our meetings.

Fulton, Ill. The 12th annual reunion for Kiwanians, merchants and farmers was held in December with an attendance of over 300. A ladies' night was also held in one of the rural communities.

Greenville, N. C. A booster dinner, attended by all civic groups, was held in honor of the Greenville Tobacco Market, one of the largest in the

Harrisburg, Ill. We raised sufficient funds so the agriculture class at the high school could continue its work in a hog program.

Hinton, Okla. The major objective in 1934 was a soil improvement program and terracing campaign to prevent erosion. The club is purchasing livestock for the Future Farmers of America organization. The fourth annual rodeo was held in August.

Hope, Ark. A series of good-will tours was made to various rural districts.

The club held an essay contest on "Should wealth be re-distributed? If so, how can it be accomplished?"

Kent, Wash. A committee of Kiwanians arranged for a marketing agree-

ment for the milk industry. There has also been an increased acreage for the growing of peas. Meetings were held in the farm districts to discuss current problems.

Keyport, N. J. A campaign got under way in July to exterminate Japanese beetle bugs. Awards were made to those who had exterminated the greater number of these pests. Both rural and urban citizens attended

our farmers' night banquet.
Lisbon, N. D. Good-will tours were made throughout the country districts

and we entertained over 750 people with our minstrel show.

Live Oak, Fla. Kiwanians personally financed a canning factory which utilizes the produce from local truck farms. A representative was sent to Washington, D. C. in the interest of building a marketing warehouse, and we helped to finance some of the county exhibits at the state fair. At the county fair, the club arranged a fine exhibit and out of 90 entries,

78 took awards.

Madison, S. D. Three hundred farmers attended a public meeting to learn how to obtain and use grasshopper bait furnished by the federal govern-

ment.

Manassas, Va. Our cooperation was given to make the annual dairy festival a success, and the Kiwanis float was awarded first prize. Successful meet-

ings were held throughout all the rural districts.

This brought together all the Moline business men and the rural resi-Altogether, seven meetings were held in rural territories with thousands in attendance. Two hundred and fifty women enjoyed the fourth annual home bureau educational tour. These women also visited

at the plants of local industries.

Monroe, La. A five year agricultural program which will benefit our entire parish was started early in 1934.

Montpelier, Ind. We are cooperating in a financial way to help the farm bureau and all 4-H club work.

Morris, Minn. Kiwanis ingenuity made it possible for the executives of the Land O' Lakes organization to select this community as the first choice for a \$1,000.00 plant. A committee sought to locate available pasture land in the northern part of the state and made tentative arrangements for its use. A tree planting project was started among the rural boys and girls. A home beautification program for the county is being conducted by 4-H club members. Arrangements were made for a semi-annual free auction and market day program and we entertained four-hundred 4-H county fair exhibitors.

Nephi, Utah. An appropriation was secured for the drilling of a deep well to give us a water supply during the drought emergency. Each year the club sends members of the 4-H club to a training school at the College of Agriculture at Logan. We made a series of good-will tours

to neighboring rural communities.

New Kensington, Pa. A number of Kiwanis-Farmer meetings were very enjoyable. Prizes were awarded for the oldest farmer, the farmer with the largest family, the oldest bachelor farmer, the youngest mother, etc.

Bowling Green, Ky. Assistance was given the farm agent to develop a boys' potato club; sponsored a dinner in honor of the 4-H club winners and sent one member to the National Livestock Show in Chicago; and gave our support in a campaign conducted by the local Tobacco Board of Trade.

Brockport, N. Y. Our seventh year of 4-H club work started in 1934. A large potato project was carried out successfully by the young people Carrington, N. D. Girls of the 4-H clubs were organized in sewing and cooking groups. A two-day exhibit displayed the 4-H projects in livestock, vegetables, sewing, cooking, etc., with prizes for the winners. All during the year the club conducted programs in nearby communities.

Chanute, Kan. In 1934 we began our fifth year for promoting the activities of the agricultural class in the high school. A plot of ground was obtained for practical demonstrations. Good-will visits were made to all

the farming districts.

Charleston, S. C. The 400 members of the 4-H clubs and the groups from

the Agricultural Society were entertained.

Chattanooga, Tenn. A rally and fair was held for the 4-H clubs of the county and we distributed 350 merchandise and other cash prizes for

Columbus, Wis. The Club Committee on Agriculture conducted a grain judging and seed identification contest for all the students in the 25 rural schools.

Delhi, N. Y. The 650 young people at the 4-H camp were entertained. Douglas, Ga. The county was divided into districts and Kiwanians were appointed advisers to farm boys in these various areas to urge them to organize into groups, work out agricultural projects, and study all

methods for improving farm conditions.

East Aurora, N. Y. At the achievement day meeting of the 4-H clubs, the boys and girls and their fathers explained the individual projects and the successes and failures that had been experienced during the year. Diplomas were presented as awards. A speaking contest was held to find the winners who would compete in state and national contests. Our agricultural activities include seed improvement, poultry, vegetable

gardens and dairying.
Elmira, N. Y. We had 550 members of the 4-H clubs as our guests on the annual achievement day. Farmers were entertained at our meetings and

a large delegation of Kiwanians visited at Grange meetings.

Enderlin, N. D. Twenty-two booths were erected for displaying the achievement day exhibits of the 4-H and Homemaker clubs. In the evening 2,500 farmers and their wives enjoyed a dance, lunch, and free program.

Fergus Falls, Minn. All products grown by the young people were exhibited at the county fair. Prizes were awarded on the basis of the best garden and products.

Fond du Lac, Wis. Trophy cups and plaques were awarded to the winners in 14 different projects. Products were exhibited at the county fair.

Gas City, Ind. Organized a 4-H club pig project; sent two young people to the state leadership camp and assisted in paying the salary of the county agent directing 4-H club work. We also took an active part in a county corn show.

Glens Falls, N. Y. Three hundred and fifty boys and girls were registered

in a potato club.

Greensburg, Ind. The 4-H club boys again won honors at the state corn show. One youth was selected as the winner at the International Livestock exhibits in Chicago. Good-will tours were made to the country.

Harrisonville, Mo. Funds were made available to purchase premiums for the winners in the calf and colt show at the time of the annual achievement day meeting of the 4-H clubs. Sixty farmers were guests at a club meeting, and Kiwanians assisted in hastening the signing of corn and hog contracts. For the 10th consecutive year, we have entertained the delegates to a clover conference. Financial assistance was also given for any activation of the second statement. given for an annual horse show.

Hartford, Conn. Twenty pure-bred calves have been distributed among 4-H club members in the county.

Indiana Kiwanis District. During the past three years, 835 young men and women from 80 counties in the state have attended the 4-H Leadership Training Camp, which is financially sponsored by the Kiwanis clubs of the Indiana District. Over 40,000 club boys and girls in Indiana before the end of 1934 have had some part of this camp experience passed on to them by their leaders.

Jackson, Ky. Kiwanis sponsored a county school fair for about 3,000 children, parents and teachers. A potato project was conducted successfully

in 1934.

Memphis, Tenn. Corn and cotton seed was purchased for 100 boys engaged in agricultural projects. In 1930 the club began its work with a pure-bred Jersey calf project for 4-H clubs. A float was entered in the Memphis cotton carnival.

Middlesboro, Ky. The Club Committee on Agriculture gave 8,000 straw-berry plants to young farm people. The Chamber of Commerce was helped in organizing a Potato Growers' Association.

Milwaukee, Wis. Awarded scholarships to 4-H club leaders and sent one of the leading winners to the National 4-H Congress in Chicago. Three Kiwanis trophies were awarded at a mid-winter county fair, and farmers were frequent guests of the club.

Neillsville, Wis. Donated prizes for a county-wide rural school seed judging contest and assisted farmers in starting a dairy relief program. A banquet was held for the county 4-H club leaders.

- New Westminster, B. C. The Agricultural Committee has started three sheep clubs and arranged for prize money to be distributed among the winners at an annual fair where boys and girls judged in stock competitions. Trophies were purchased for this event. Visits were made to all rural fairs.
- Oklahoma City, Okla. Kiwanis approved a loan for the rural schools to make repairs on buildings, and helped to carry on activities of the Future Farmers of America.

Ottawa, Ont. On the opening day of the Central Canada Exhibition, Kiwanis entertained 300 young farm people.

Pampa, Tex. Organized a poultry club of 25 farm boys, and paid the expenses for one 4-H club boy to attend the state fair at Dallas.

Peninsula-Portland, Ore. Kiwanians made the necessary contacts among 4-H groups for promoting flower and vegetable gardens. All the young people were entertained at a picnic in June.

Philippi, W. Va. Kiwanis entertained outstanding 4-H club boys and girls and placed into operation a county-wide campaign to help these young people attain the highest standards in school work, health, and agricul-

tural projects.

Prince Albert, Sask. A junior fair with nearly 400 exhibitors in potato and poultry competition was held in October. The club for the past four years has been distributing seed potatoes and settings of eggs to rural school children. Prizes were awarded in stock judging contests and the young people heard various lectures on agricultural subjects.

Regina, Sask. Prizes were awarded to the winners in a seed competition

contest.

Richmond, Ind. Sponsored the annual county 4-H round up and presented two silver cups to winners in a county pure-bred colt association. A spelling bee was conducted for the 4-H clubs, and six boys and girls were sent to the Junior Leadership Training Camp at Indianapolis.

Riverdale, Toronto, Ont. On agricultural day awards were made for the best garden plots and medals were presented to the children having the high-

est scholastic records.

Sioux Falls, S. D. Five boys and girls were sent to Brookings to attend a 4-H club short course at the state college. Assisted local people in securing poison grasshopper bait. Kiwanians visited with all their friends at Renner.

Spokane Valley, Wash. Miss Delia Faler was sent to the national 4-H club convention at Washington, D. C. The 4-H fair was held in the fall of the year and we organized girls in a sewing class. Scholarships were available for the young farm people. We celebrated national apple week.

Sumter, S. C. Kiwanis sponsored county 4-H club work and entertained 400 farm youths during the county fair. Each Kiwanian is responsible for making personal contacts with the young people, encouraging them in their school and agricultural work.

Syracuse, N. Y. We were hosts to 580 boys and girls of the 4-H clubs who were visiting at Syracuse university.

Tallahassee, Fla. Three scholarships were given to girls of the county who

were in attendance at the home demonstration short course.

Tillamook, Ore. Awarded 4-H achievement pins; conducted various farm and rural visitations; assisted in plans for a 4-H fair; made it possible for 60 young farm people to receive health examinations; and furnished speakers at various rural gatherings.

ment banquet and we were hosts to all these young people. Beaumont, Tex. Kiwanis day was observed at the county fair, and a series

of good-will trips were made to surrounding towns.

Evansville, Ind. Kiwanis sponsored the annual 4-H fair, and also assisted local merchants in a tri-state farm products exhibit.

Harlan, Ky. The Club Committee on Agriculture was in charge of the sixth annual fall festival and flower show. The 4-H clubs from every section of the county participated.

Hobart, Okla. We were responsible for the success of the southwest dairy show.

International Falls, Minn. A county seed show was held in February, and Kiwanis sponsored a banquet for all the members of the county 4-H clubs.

VOCATIONAL GUIDANCE

Vocational guidance was added during the convention year of 1925-26 by Kiwanis as an International Objective. Listed here are a few of the undertakings for 1934:

Arlington, Mass. Vocational guidance books were given to the junior high schools.

Ashland, Ky. The Key club at the high school has been thoroughly organized and every young member has a Kiwanian as his personal advisor. At each Kiwanis meeting we have one of the high school students familiarizing himself with the club and our activities.

Austin, Tex. Over 3,500 students in general assemblies heard vocational guidance lectures. In local libraries vocational volumes are available and

the club's committee prepared a city-wide vocational survey.

Boonville, Mo. A nationally known vocational counselor was brought to the city to interview and lecture to students and special groups. The club is also making this program available to all rural schools.

Bremerton, Wash. A counselor service was established for high school students. This consists of informing young people on various business

and professional careers and problems.

Brookhaven, Miss. A carpenter shop was started so boys could learn the

art of furniture making.

Chicago, Ill. A Kiwanian supervised activities for 20,000 men on relief. The work covered handicraft, typing, bookkeeping, drafting, etc. Reading matter was furnished and during one month there was an attendance of over 55,000 for such studies.

Clatskanie, Ore. A class of 35 high school students are engaged in general

vocational guidance studies.

Davenport, Iowa. While general vocational counsel is available, the club is also interested in those boys and girls who do not have a definite vocational preference. An attempt is made to find at least some hobby or interest which might develop into a vocation.

East Los Angeles, Calif. Wives of Kiwanians assisted over 1,300 high school girls. Twenty-seven boys' groups are being given advice by leading business and professional men. Members are constantly in attendance

at Key club meetings.

Gainesville, Fla. A large collection of vocational guidance literature has been placed in the high schools. Commercial firms are cooperating in giving high school students information and practical experience.

Hollywood, Calif. The fourth annual vocational conference, including all

business and professional groups, was held in May.

Inglewood, Calif. Twenty prominent business and professional men coun-

seled with high school groups.

Jackson, Ky. A vocational guidance survey was made of the city and county. Our territory was the third county in the United States where such a survey was completed. This is the beginning of an extensive program in vocational undertaking.

Joliet, Ill. Several hundred boys were given vocational counsel and others were helped in securing their text books and employment. The club also contacts students who need to improve in their high school work.

Kalispell, Mont. The club Committee on Vocational Guidance placed high school boys in stores and offices where they could get both part-time work and training.

Kellogg, Idaho. Classes are held in airplane modeling, electrical and metal work, astronomy, tool making, photography, etc. It is planned to begin vocational guidance counseling with high school freshmen.

Lancaster, Calif. The vocational guidance class at the high school holds weekly meetings for instruction and counsel.

Lewistown, Mont. Thirty students have been placed with business concerns in the city and a series of vocational books has been placed in the rural schools and community clubs.

Longview, Wash. Two groups of students are helped; one the freshmen in their vocational civic studies and the other the upper division students, who demand specific information in regard to their life work. There are group addresses and business men counsel with over 150 students.

VOCATIONAL GUIDANCE-Cont.

- Los Angeles, Calif. Thirty-three speakers outlined business and professional pursuits for high school students and all young men had the opportunity of attending a vocational program day. The Key club at the McKinley Home continues to be a very active and progressive group.
- Martinsville, Va. A prize was offered for the best essay on "How to Choose a Vocation."
- Miami, Fla. We held 33 vocational conferences for over 1,300 students.

 Qualified speakers presented outlines on business and professional pursuits.
- Montclair, N. J. In cooperation with the Y. M. C. A., a graduate club was formed. During the last two years high school graduates have been having a difficult time because of unemployment conditions. The club members meet to discuss the necessary qualifications for business.
- Morgantown, W. Va. Kiwanians attend the weekly meeting of the University high school Key club.
- Moultrie, Ga. Kiwanians take one or more members of the senior high school class into their plants or offices for several weeks' training and experience. Every Kiwanian has pledged himself 100 per cent in this work.
- Oakland, Calif. Since 1928 we have had a Key club in the Oakland high school. Speakers meet with this group to advise the boys about various vocations. A survey was made so another similar Key club could be started in Oakland.
- Olympia, Wash. Vocational guidance activities are managed on the conference plan, through which boys and girls receive part-time employment, are assisted in general vocational education, have special interviews, attend conferences on "Training for Business and Industry," and receive the advantages of a placement bureau. This bureau is much favored in our town and during 1934 over 1,167 jobs were obtained for young people. The vocational library at the high school contains 193 books and 480 pamphlets on vocational guidance. The prosecuting attorney's office secures adult advisers for all boys paroled from the court and industrial school. The club is constantly attempting to place boys and girls in business offices. The estimated total amount of money the young people received from their work was \$3,693.00.
- Pittsburgh, Pa. Vocational conferences were held in all the city's high schools, with an attendance of over 5,000 students.
- Provo, Utah. Our main objective has been to give 198 high school graduates vocational guidance. Our work with college officials enabled us to place 65 young people in college, who otherwise would not have been able to go. Vocational books have been placed in the libraries.
- Riverside, Calif. Five hundred high school youths were given vocational talks and interviews on all branches of business, industry and professional careers.
- Salem, Mass. Thirty organizations attended a meeting for creating a community vocational guidance council.
- Toronto, Ont. Youths receive instruction in printing, wood-working, basketry, telegraphy, electrical engineering, etc. Our toy shop completed 200 toys and the printing class takes care of the printing for the Boys' Work Committee. In woodworking, tables were made for the Kiwanis camp.
- Vancouver, B. C. Vocational lectures were given at 14 schools.
- Washington, D. C. Weekly vocational broadcasts, with copies of radio addresses available to all interested persons, is one of our major activities. Speakers were also sent to C. C. C. camps and counselor service was organized. All teachers and school officials are cooperating with Kiwanians in this work.
- Weatherford, Okla. Every high school student has met with an experienced supervisor who gives vocational direction and counsel.
- West Bend, Wis. Speakers were engaged to give educational, vocational and hobby talks at the high school. Assistance was also given in organizing a hobby show and leisure time program.

Woodlawn, Chicago. A junior art class for young people between the ages of 12 and 18, who wish to specialize in commercial art, was started in 1934. The junior study club is in its third year, with an enrollment of young men who are interested in studying modern business trends, specializing in marketing, merchandising, advertising, finance, etc.

entertained and given an automobile trip.

Charlotte, N. C. A maternity clinic assists destitute and expectant mothers. Chicago, Ill. A collection of discarded but serviceable shoes for men, women and children was made and a Kiwanian in the shoe business had them all repaired at a small cost. The shoes were turned over to the Salvation Army.

Chisholm, Minn. The major objective of the club is a broom factory for the With the cooperation of the fire department, old toys were colblind.

lected, repaired, repainted and distributed among the needy.

Cincinnati, Ohio. The club seeks the cooperation of all business in finding employment for persons afflicted with deafness. Seeds were supplied to the unemployed for their community gardens.

Clinton, Iowa. Over 700 relief gardens were aided by the Kiwanis garden committee. These had a total value of \$8,200.00.

Coeur d'Alene, Idaho. A committee was appointed to secure governmental

cooperation for a community canning factory for preserving surplus fruits and vegetables and also to develop a brick yard and mattress factory.

Commerce, Ga. A canning plant, installed by Kiwanis, preserved over \$600.00

worth of meat and vegetables.

Des Moines, Iowa. Our annual activity is conducting a shoe repair shop for salvaging all discarded shoes, repairing them and distributing to all needy persons.

Falmouth, Mass. A wheel chair was purchased and is being loaned in the

community to those who need it.

Fargo, N. D. We conducted our fourth annual toy shop, making it possible for 1,300 children to receive toys at Christmas. The manual training classes of the junior and senior high schools repaired and repainted the toys and fleets of laundry trucks collected and distributed them later.

Fullerton, Calif. An active campaign was got under way urging people to repair furnishings and homes and in this way provide work for the unemployed. A home was built for a widow and six children and later paid the taxes to save it for the family.

Kansas City, Mo. The club entertained, for the third year, 3,500 children with Christmas carols, candy, fruit and toys.
 Lakewood, Ohio. The fifth annual used clothes drive made it possible for

us to provide clothing for over 1,000 people. Every effort was made to reach people who were not on relief. Confidential cards to get this information were given to members of churches, lodges, etc.

Minneapolis, Minn. Members purchased over \$600.00 worth of merchandise from the Society for the Blind and Kiwanians took 210 mothers and their children to the Salvation Army camp at Silver Lake. We furnished gifts and entertainment for a Christmas party at a hospital.

Montreal, P. Q. Food and supplies were given to 892 needy families. The contents of each basket had a retail value of \$5.00, making a total value of \$4,460.00. Wives of Kiwanians formed a sewing circle and completed over 2,000 hand-made articles, the larger portion of which was given to hospitals and orphanages for charity work.

Omaha, Neb. Boys at the Webster school shoe repair shop repaired 1,640 pairs of shoes, all of which were given to the needy school children. The club sponsored monthly meetings, programs and a picnic for the Society

of the Blind.

Paulsboro, N. J. Fuel, food, medicine and employment were given to unfortunate families and their children.

Red Bluff, Calif. Our old clothes drive brought us 4,000 articles for dis-

tribution among the needy.

Richmond Hill, N. Y. We secured employment for needy individuals and during the summer supplied milk to poor families. Over 1,000 children attended our Christmas movie party, at which time candy and gifts were distributed.

South Side, St. Louis, Mo. A young couple, married about a year, lost their resources. The club had the case investigated and, with assistance, made it possible for these young people to remain together. Several other destitute cases were given attention.

Spokane, Wash. Twenty-five mothers and 115 children occupied the 25 Pensioned Mothers' homes during 1934. These homes have an appraised value of \$47,000.00. Mothers paid \$10.00 to \$15.00 a month rental. During the year \$3,419.00 was spent for maintenance and purchase of homes. Kiwanians were assigned to individual homes and many contributions of clothing, furniture, fuel, etc., were made by members. Medical work was supplied free by doctors and dentists. Twenty gallons of milk are supplied daily for the children. The Pensioned Mothers' sewing group, for which the club buys material, made 250 garments and canned 450 quarts of fruits and vegetables for winter use. A camp vacation was enjoyed by 23 of the Pensioned Mothers.

Waco, Tex. Over 4,000 children were given toys, candy and fruit at Christ-

mas time. Eight destitute families were given help.
Wichita, Kan. Kiwanians assisted in a drive to raise \$10,000.00 for the building of a home for the aged. Seventy-five hundred children from all the institutional homes in the city were given a Christmas party.

HOSPITALS

Ann Arbor, Mich. A sale was held for three days to raise funds for our recreational program at the University Hospital. The profit was \$2,200.00.

Aurora, Ill. We assisted in sponsoring an increased tax rate for the support

of a tubercular sanitarium.

Berwyn, Ill. During hospital week over 2500 cans of fruit and vegetables were collected for our local institution. Admission to motion picture shows was either a can of fruit or vegetables.

Bremerton, Wash. All Kiwanians participated in a drive for funds for the Children's Orthopedic Hospital at Seattle.

Brownwood, Tex. The club assisted in securing a charity ward in the local hospital for both city and county patients.

Dayton, Wash. A new hospital costing \$24,000.00, the money being donated by Kiwanian John Brining, will be furnished throughout by the citizens

of the community.

Gallup, N. M. A tag day secured \$600.00 to care for charity patients at St.

Mary's Hospital.

Hominy, Okla. A Heidbrink aero-tent was purchased for the use of local doctors in treatment of all cases requiring oxygen.

Memphis, Tenn. Over \$3,000.00 was secured from President Roosevelt's birthday observance and ball.

Ontario, Ore. Lack of finances had caused the local hospital rooms to become in need of repair. The club made it possible to renovate floors, walls and ceilings of a four-bed ward. Plans are under way for a complete renovation and the installation of radios and new furniture.

Pensacola, Fla. The club has been responsible for the development of a tubercular sanitarium.

Philadelphia, Pa. A program was held to observe hospital week in September, at which time we entertained the president-elect of the American Hospital Association.

Rutherford-South Bergen, N. J. Magazines were collected and sent to hospitals and institutions.

St. Lawrence, Montreal, P. Q. A large assortment of bed linen was purchased and donated to a hospital.

Tyler, Tex. Our main objective is to interest the community in the building of a new hospital.

Woodlawn, Chicago. The Woodlawn Hospital, which has on its staff some of our own Kiwanians, invited the entire club to luncheon. Our past president, who is chief of the staff, explained the financial condition of the institution and all members were conducted through the hospital.

HEALTH AND SANITATION

The following shows the ways in which Kiwanis clubs worked to improve health and sanitary conditions in their communities:

Ada, Okla. The club found that the local milk ordinance was not being enforced and cooperated with the health authorities. Encouraged retail grocers to sell only grade A milk, published a list of grade A dairies and ran advertisements in the local newspapers asking the public to inquire about all milk production and consumption.

All-Chicago Kiwanis Clubs. Members of the metropolitan area clubs pledged themselves to do all in their power to prevent a local ordinance, which would prohibit animal experimentation by medical scientists.

Ashtabula, Ohio. The annual Christmas seal sale was conducted successfully. Each year the first meeting in February is known as health day. The county public health association is responsible for the program.

Bay City, Mich. A series of radio broadcasts over a local station on "Public Health" received the cooperation of the county medical society. Talks were given twice a week by local physicians, who were introduced by members of the Kiwanis club.

HEALTH AND SANITATION-Cont.

Bell and Maywood, Calif. We had 192 babies examined by local doctors. Our baby show in March was one of the outstanding activities of the club. The parents of each child entered were given a photograph and prizes were awarded to the winners.

Bradford, Ill. Tests were made of the water supply of rural schools.

Carthage, Ill. A special meeting was held for the county medical association

and the physicians were responsible for the program.

Columbia, Tenn. The club sponsors a blue ribbon health campaign. Requirements necessary to become a blue ribbon child are making satisfactory progress in school studies, good general discipline, health requirements and examinations and freedom from remediable physical defects. This year some 2,400 children took part in our health parade.

Delaware, Ohio. Our objective is to unite both the city and county boards of health, which will promote better health activities.

Forest Park, Ill. Diphtheria and small pox immunization were got under way with the cooperation of the board of education. A survey was made among all children attending public and parochial schools showing whether they had been immunized.

Jefferson City, Mo. Through our clinic, assistance was given medical authorities during a diphtheria epidemic. Our assistance is also being given

for securing funds to conduct an anti-tuberculosis campaign.

Kennewick, Wash. The club sponsored prizes in a health contest, which was directed by the county nurse. Kiwanians have endorsed the action of county commissioners in establishing a budget for securing the services

of this county nurse.

Live Oak, Fla. Demonstrations of how to conduct a sick room and the proper care of patients were sponsored by our club. All mothers in the community were given an opportunity to attend these demonstrations. Expectant mothers are taught child care. An appeal was sent out to all

home owners in a mosquito control campaign.

Madison, S. D. Our assistance was given local doctors in a campaign for vaccinating and immunizing all school children against diphtheria and

small pox.

Monroe, Ga. The club arranged for a mass meeting for promoting a \$25,000.00 engineering project for eliminating malaria in five counties. The project covers three river systems and if completed would mean an expenditure of one and one-half million dollars.

Montreal, P. Q. The club undertook the sponsorship for the sale of Christmas seals. In the past only \$10,000.00 was raised from this sale and the club hoped to increase this amount by a considerable sum.

Paulsboro, N. J. Distributed 100 toothbrushes and 1,000 tubes of toothpaste and cakes of soap among school children.

San Francisco, Calif. The club pays for the services of a health nurse who

works in the Telegraph Hill neighborhood. Over 500 children and several hundred adults are given examinations at a clinic and those needing hospital assistance are referred to various institutions. The nurse also educates mothers in child care.

South Side, St. Louis, Mo. A study was made of the milk situation and our cooperation was given to have passed an ordinance guaranteeing an adequately guarded milk supply for the municipal area.

Victoria, B. C. A booth at the provincial exhibition made it possible for us to distribute 3,000 pamphlets and weigh thousands of adults and children. Over 13,000 appeal letters were sent out in a Christmas seal campaign.

Other clubs were interested in general health clinics, sanitariums and camps, in selling health seals, guarding against epidemics, purchasing equipment for health organizations and giving assistance to community nurses and health officers; securing pure milk, good water supply, proper sewage disposal and cleaning up polluted streams.

Bastrop, La. An attempt is being made to secure a fish and game preserve for this parish.

Clatskanie, Ore. There were released from our pens 400 pheasants and 25,000 fish for the Clatskanie River.
