Held seminar for associate faculty to increase opportunity for their use of Oncourse. Two full-time faculty attended oncourse workshop at the Center for Teaching and Learning. TCEM Department increased use of webtcem.com for streaming video courses. Increase opportunities for student interaction

Evidence of Progress for 2001-2002:

Retention rates for freshmen/sophomores rose 8% for the school in the last year. They rose 5% for sophomores and juniors. Enrollments in video streaming classes continue to rise.

Fiscal Health

The School of Physical Education and Tourism Management continues to be on solid fiscal ground, as it has been since the inception of Responsibility Center Management. Because of inordinate increases in both head count and credit hours in the last fiscal year, there was a net operating balance of \$313,698. The school currently has a tuition reserve of \$155,137, which is more than twice the requirements of the trustees 3% reserve requirement.

In addition to the tuition reserve, we have allocable resources of \$328,343. These reserves will allow us to internally fund most of our cash initiatives including research support, student recruitment and retention, and technology advances.

Reallocation Plan

The School of Physical Education and Tourism Management has not received any reallocation funds in the last three years, but is requesting for 2003-04, base funds in the amount of \$62,000 to hire one additional tenure track faculty in the Department of Tourism, Conventions and Event Management. Enrollment in that department has more than doubled in the last three years. We have achieved all of the benchmarks established for the program when it was approved with the exception of degrees awarded, which will be reached in the current year. Indianapolis and Central Indiana is a very fertile location for growth in tourism, cultural tourism, and meetings and conventions. Our graduates continue to find meaningful, good paying jobs, mainly in the area. To keep up with the demand, we need to increase enrollments, but need additional faculty to do so.
