Backpack Attack has been around for 10 years working to raise school supplies for IPS students. IUPUI and Barnes and Noble at IUPUI have paired up to help them reach their goal of a half million school supplies.

[M. Posch] The Backpack Attack is actually a citywide school supply drive that helps children in IPS get the supplies that they need to begin the school year. This year our goal is a half million school supplies. As a part of that, since the drive usually takes place in the summer, we've partnered up with Barnes and Noble here at IUPUI to get the students more engaged since they are on campus right now.

So we've partnered with Barnes and Noble to be able to do a program where students at the end of the semester will be able to donate their books instead of selling their textbooks they can in fact donate them back to the Backpack Attack. So what they'll do is it'll be just like them selling their books back. Except instead of them receiving the money, the Backpack Attack will receive the money that then we'll be able to use to go buy supplies for the underprivileged IPS children this year.

The buyback starts on April 28th and will run through finals. They'll be able to come here, or there'll be a couple of satellite locations around campus that Barnes and Noble will set up to do buybacks. There'll be bins on site that people will just be encouraged to put their books in the bins, and Barnes and Noble will price them out just the way they'd price your textbook to give you money. They'll price out all of the textbooks, and they'll write Backpack Attack a generous check for everybody's donations.
