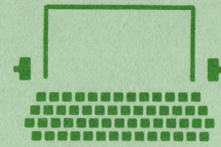

## HOST FAMILIES STILL NEEDED

Indianapolis-area families are needed to host a foreign social worker July 12-Aug. 16. The 12 social workers from 11 foreign countries arrived here April 30 as part of an exchange program sponsored by the School of Social Work and the Council of International Programs.

Currently, the social workers are working in hospitals and health care settings in Indianapolis Monday through Thursday and are meeting on campus every Friday for academic seminars and the exchange of methods and philosophies between their countries and the United States.

Another important part of the program is cross-cultural social exchange. To provide the visitors with firsthand experience of America and American family life, each of them will live with three different host families while they are here. A number of social events are planned to give all the host families the opportunity to meet all the visitors and to create a feeling of community among the participants. The social workers are living with their first-period host families and will move to the second-period families Saturday, where they will stay until July 12.

The 12 visitors come from Thailand, Sweden, Kenya, England, Israel, the Netherlands, West Germany, South Africa and Denmark.

To qualify, families must be able to provide a private room and morning and evening meals for their guests. They should live within reasonable walking distance of a bus line or be able to transport their visitor to work and seminars.
