TWO OPENINGS, TWO SHOWS, ONE PLACE

The Gallery at the Herron School of Art will open two shows for the month of February with a reception February 1 from 7 p.m. to 10 p.m..

On view in the West Gallery will be <u>"Sculpture Indiana: Breath and Beauty"</u> (photographs of sculpture). Also opening that night will be the <u>"Faculty Exhibition"</u> which presents the works of the school's full-time studio faculty members, about 48 works by 23 artists.

"Sculpture Indiana" consists of 16-inch by 20-inch black-and-white photos executed by the 10 finalists in a competition to award \$20,000 in commissions for public sculpture to artists from Indiana. The program was started last year by the Gallery and the Lafayette Art Center, with the support of the Indiana Arts Commission and the National Endowment for the Arts.

The 10 finalists represented in the show will be Gary Freeman and Peg Lovett, both of Indianapolis; Alan Greenberg and Rick Paul, both of Lafayette; Barry Heheman, Margaret Lanterman and Steve Laucking, all of Chicago; Jim Huntington, New York City; Robert Pessler, Dayton, Ohio, and John Spofforth, Athens, Ohio.

The "Faculty Exhibition," which includes prints, sculpture, paintings, ceramics, drawings, illustrations and photographs, focuses on the pivotal role that Herron faculty members play in the cultural life of the institution and the city.

Among the exhibitors will be Lance Baber, Robert Berkshire, Edmund Brucker, Stanley Burford, Sarah Burns, Harry Davis, William Detmers, Rose Divita, Adolfo Doddoli, Robert Eagerton and Gary Edson.

Also M.D. Fierke, Gary Freeman, Darryl Jones, James Janecek, Steve Mannheimer, Neil Matthew, Richard Nickolson, Jan Tenenbaum-Aguet, Phillip Tennant, Ralph Thomas, Dale Traugott and Robert Weaver.

Both shows will be on display through February 29. Gallery hours are 9 a.m. to 7 p.m. Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday, and from 9 a.m. to 9 p.m. on Wednesday.

R&R -- Broady-Campbell, Inc., contractor, plans to start repairing the south front entrance to the Medical Science Building on Monday, weather permitting. This will involve removing the flagstone terrace and granite steps. Fire regulations prohibit locking the four front doors, so persons should use other entrances to the building. The work will require about three weeks to complete. When the south entrance is reopened for use, similar repairs will be started on the north front entrance.
