DR. RYAN'S ADDRESS THURSDAY

Indiana University President John W. Ryan will deliver a closed-circuit television address to the eight campuses in the I.U. system at 3:30 p.m. tomorrow (Thursday, October 25).

The address will be telecast over the facilities of the Indiana Higher Education Telecommunications System and received on educational monitors at the campuses in Fort Wayne, South Bend, Gary, Kokomo, Indianapolis, Bloomington, New Albany and Richmond.

Viewing centers on the IUPUI campus will be Room 114 in the School of Dentistry, Room 144 in Cavanaugh Hall and the auditorium in Emerson Hall. The address will be videotaped and rebroadcast Friday (October 26) in Room 259 of the Krannert Building on the 38th Street Campus.

OVERSEAS STUDY FOR IUPUI STUDENTS

Qualified students in the Indiana University system can choose from several programs to do part of their academic work in other countries.

The university's full-year academic programs are held in Sao Paulo, Brazil; Strasbourg, France; Hamburg, Germany; Bologna, Italy; Jerusalem, Israel; Madrid, Spain, and Lima, Peru. Participating students receive IUPUI credit, not transfer credit; 30 to 36 credit hours are customary in the academic year program. The deadline for applications for full-year programs is November 1.

<u>IUPUI</u> students may also participate in summer programs in Dijon, France, and <u>Mexico City</u>. Six to eight hours of academic credit are customary. The deadline for applications for summer programs is April 1.

Dean Walter Nugent, director of the All-University Overseas Study Office, will be in Room 141 of Cavanaugh Hall on Monday (October 29) at 3 p.m. to meet with interested students.
