

### HIGH TECH IN THE NEWSROOM

Five Pulitzer Prize winners are among 15 of the nation's leading journalists meeting on campus March 16-18 to offer a "nuts and bolts" look at new computer technology use in contemporary reporting. This first-of-its-kind national Conference on Advanced Investigative Methods for Journalists is sponsored by the IU School of Journalism at IUPUI, the National Institute for Advanced Reporting and the national Investigative Reporters and Editors organization. Nearly 400 journalists are expected to get a look at electronic information gathering and what to do with that information, says James W. Brown, associate dean of the IU journalism school. "We are providing the hands-on kind of information that makes highly sophisticated reporting projects possible for all news organizations, especially small and medium-size dailies," he said.

"Computers have opened a new world in collecting and interpreting information, but in this high-tech era, we can never forget the basic reporting and writing skills," said former investigative reporter Sherry Ricchiardi, now assistant professor of journalism and director of professional services for the institute. "It's more of a challenge than ever to humanize these complex stories and to make them relevant and readable."

Scheduled speakers include Pulitzer Prize winners Bill Dedman of The Washington Post, Richard Mauer of The Anchorage Daily News, Andrew Schneider of The Pittsburgh Press and a director of the institute, Lucy Morgan of The St. Petersburg Times and Elliot Jaspin of the University of Missouri.

### CRUMBLING IRON CURTAIN FOCUS OF TWO PROGRAMS

The swirl of "sea-change" events in the Soviet Union and Eastern Europe is the center of attention and discussion for two programs on campus.

First, the International Affairs Club meeting Feb. 12 will feature a special presentation by Richard A. Fredland, chairman and professor of political science, on "The World Turned Upside Down." Fredland was in Eastern Europe over the holidays. The meeting will be in Cavanaugh 438 from 11:30 a.m.-12:30 p.m. All are invited.

Second, the political science department is offering a one-credit short course called "The USSR: Changing Perspectives" through March 20. Dimitri Osipov, a linguist from the University of Leningrad, is the instructor. He is spending the year in the U.S. under the auspices of the Council for International Programs. The course, which meets Tuesdays and Thursdays from 4-5:15 p.m., looks at the dramatic changes taking place within the Soviet Union, as well as Soviet perspectives on the world. Katherine Brady, internationally recognized expert and activist on the issues of rape, date rape, sexual child abuse, incest and sexual harassment, is the final speaker in the Distinguished Speakers Lecture Series. 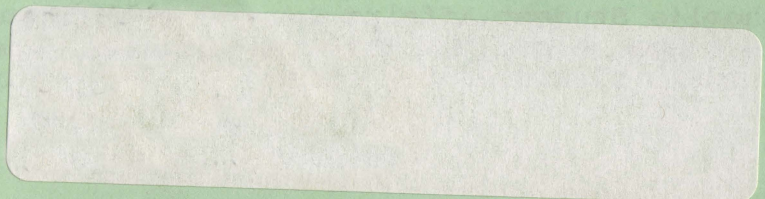

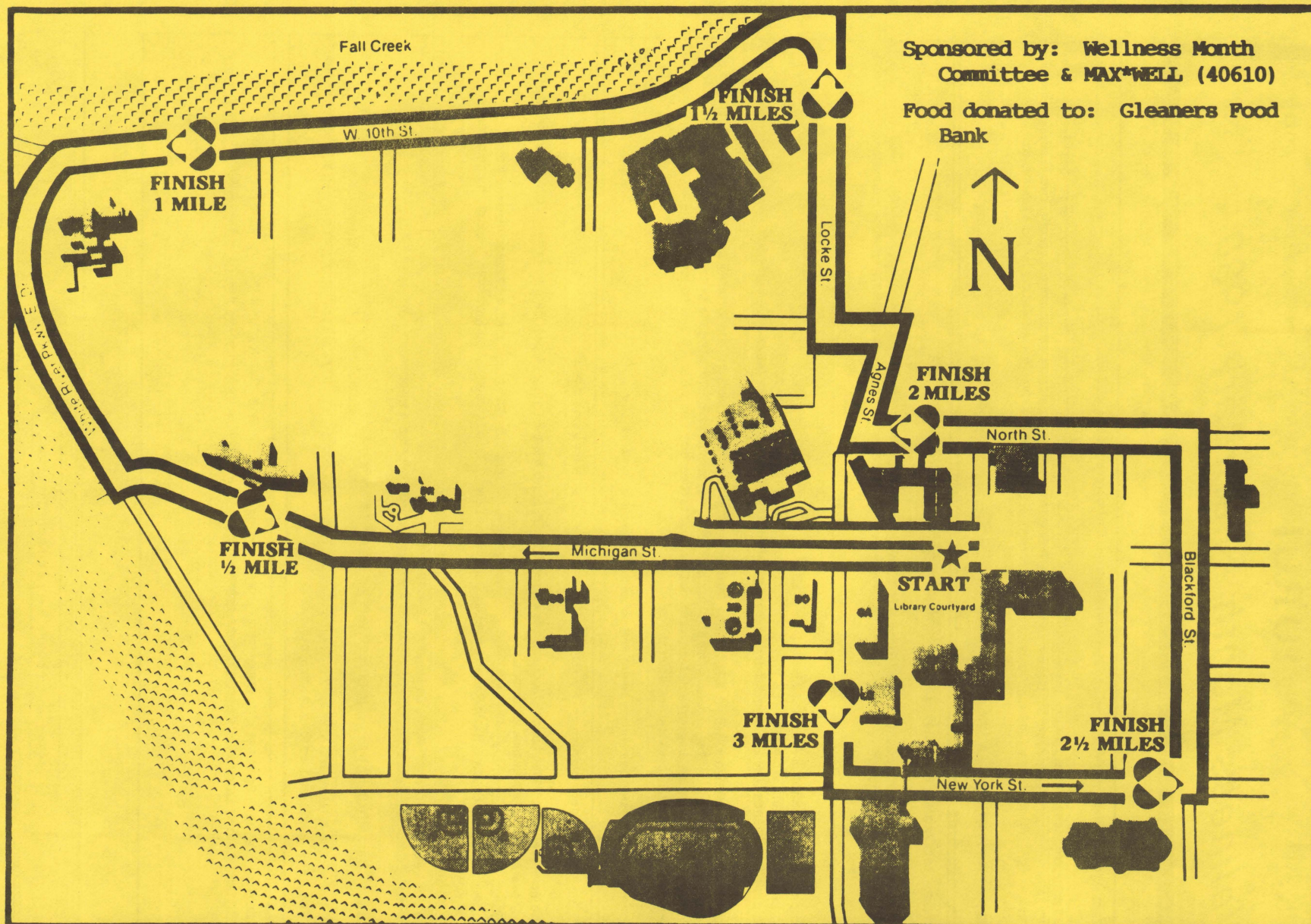
