Frank Feigl Named Distinguished Alumnus

Dr. Frank L. Feigl, BS '54, PED, '74, Professor Emeritus at The Citadel, has been named the 2004 Distinguished Alumnus by the School of Physical Education and Tourism Management Alumni Association. The award was established in 1999 to recognize the achievements of a graduate of the school and is based on contributions to the profession or service to the community. Frank was presented the award during the school's annual homecoming at Camp Brosius in June, where Frank and his wife, Loretta, BS '54, regularly attend with their family.

Frank is a native of St. Louis. He spent two years at the Normal College of the American Gymnastic Union in Indianapolis before completing his BS degree at Indiana University Bloomington in 1954 with a major in physical education and minors in health education and history. After completing a masters degree from Ball State Teachers College in 1955, Frank returned to Indiana University for doctoral work, completing a PED in 1974.

After two years of teaching in a public school in Indianapolis, Frank became an assistant professor at The Citadel in 1957. He rose to the rank of associate professor in 1966 and was promoted to professor in 1975. Administratively, Frank also served The Citadel as assistant intramural director, gymnastic coach, fencing coach, director of Health Education, Director of Required Physical Education, Acting Chair, and club

advisor. Although Frank retired from The Citadel in 1989, he returned as an adjunct faculty member for the next six years.

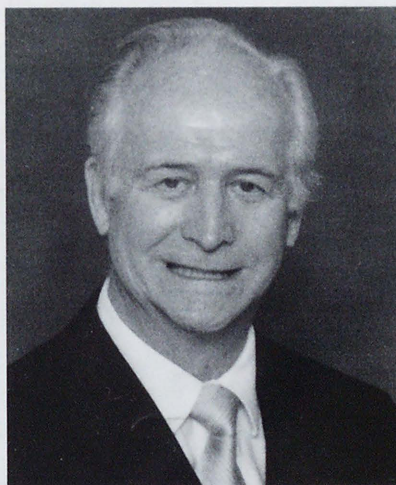
Frank has been a member of the American Alliance for Health, Physical Education, Recreation and Dance and the South Carolina Association for Health, Physical Education and Recreation. He served the state association in a number of elected capacities as well as serving 11 years as an associate editor of their journal.

Frank is also a member of three honorary societies, Phi Epsilon Kappa, Sigma Delta Psi and Phi Delta Kappa.

Frank was a four-year member of the Indiana University gymnastic team and served as captain in 1954. Because of his pas-

sion and expertise in the sport, Frank has written a number of articles on gymnastics and has continually served the sport through teaching, clinics, demonstrations, coaching and judging. He was named Coach of the Year by the Southern Intercollegiate Gymnastic League in 1964.

While maintaining an impressive professional career, Frank has continually given back to his community and church by being a faithful volunteer. Frank has received both the 35-year and 40-year Service Awards from the Carolina Lowcountry Chapter of the American Red Cross for his service as instructor for Swimming, Life Saving, and Water Safety Instructor aquatic courses as well as First Aid and CPR courses.



Lohse House Dedicated on the IUPUI Campus

IUPUI named 21 student residential "houses" and a street after community heroes and leaders during the May 26 dedication of the Campus Apartments on the River Walk.

IU President Adam W. Herbert and IUPUI Chancellor Charles R. Bantz addressed the crowd, which included IU Trustees and some 80 relatives and friends of the people honored.

One of the houses is named, "The Lohse House," after former Dean Lola L. Lohse. Dean Lohse began teaching full time at the Normal College in 1955, and in 1963 she was appointed Director of the School and Assistant Professor. In 1971 the Normal College became the IU School of Physical Education at IUPUI, and she was appointed the first Dean of the School. She retired in 1977.

The named buildings comprise a new era of campus development. IUPUI's Campus Apartments on the Riverwalk

Lola L. Lohse (1916-1999) began her career with IU as a student enrolled at the Normal College of the American Gymnastic Union in Indianapolis in 1935. She graduated from IU with a BS in physical education in 1939 and later earned an MS degree from IU. In 1955, she began teaching full-time at the Normal College and in 1963 was appointed as Director of the School and Assistant Professor. In 1971, the Normal College became the IU School of Physical Education at IUPUI and Mrs. Lohse was appointed as the first Dean. She retired from the University in 1977.

opened last fall, the first part of a three-phase plan to provide housing to approximately 10 percent of the 29,000 students attending IUPUI. Accommodating 770 students, this new community is comprised of a series of

"houses" that include 12 to 16 apartment units in each house.

Houses include one, two, and four bedroom apartments with fully furnished kitchens. Each house accommodates 22 to 46 students.

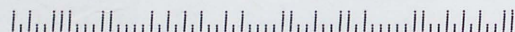
