- The Office of the Registrar compiled the information and it is provided for your reference.
- Update on PeopleSoft 9.0 upgrade
 - Good progress is continuing to be made toward the February upgrade of PS SIS/HRMS systems.
 - Dates for the upgrade have not been finalized. Tentatively plan on SIS not being available beginning Friday February 15 and returning to operation by Thursday morning, February 21.
- Opening of Admission Center, Student Financial Services, and Registrar in the Campus Center
 - The date on which the Campus Center is turned over to IUPUI has been delayed until 12/14. Enrollment Services offices will be moving the week of 12/17. We hope to have the Registrar and Student Financial Services areas functioning by 12/20 and the Admission Center functioning by 1/2/08. (NOTE: These dates were revised after the meeting due to construction delays.)
- FASPAC subcommittee is meeting to review the processes related to Satisfactory Academic Progress
 - Several of the suggestions are already in the process of being implemented. In addition to the information on SAP that all students on financial aid receive every semester, a warning message is being developed for those students who are at risk for not demonstrating satisfactory academic progress.

• IFC discussion of policy to limit application of credit from 2 year institutions to 64 credits

- The proposal for existing articulation agreements that are based on the application of more than 64 credits:
 - Students who have started an associate degree that is covered by an articulation agreement would be grandfathered.
 - When agreements are reviewed, the need for exception should be reviewed by some group such as the APPC or the new curriculum committee.

- Articulations that involve licensure or certification can apply more than 64 credits.
 - Concerns were raised about Biotech, Herron, and other articulations that were built on more than 64 credits. The sense was that the reasons they have for more than 64 credits is as justified as the reasons that the health careers merit an exception.
- Purdue School of Science has adopted a school policy limiting application to 64 credits. E & T will consider adopting the same limitation.

Items for Review, Discussion, or Action

- Archiving of OnCourse Gradebooks—Mary Beth Myers
 - All course data including the gradebook is available for 5 years. Contact the UITS support center to make the request. It will take a bit longer for original Oncourse sites because the data has been taken off of the application servers but for Oncourse CL the process simply involves unhiding the course site on the production server. Note: Stacy Morrone is working with the KB to get this process documented.
- eAdd—Mary Beth Myers
 - o eAdd will begin in January. This process begins the 2nd week after the waitlist placements have been made and will end with the end of the auto W period.
 - A faculty tip sheet has been developed and will be made available within the next couple of weeks on the Registrar website
 - o Paper drop and add forms can still be used if the department wants that option.
- eGrade Change—Mary Beth Myers
 - o eGrade change should be available by the end of this semester.
 - A tip sheet is being designed. The information should be distributed in the next couple of weeks.
- Processing Returning and Intercampus Transfer students—Jennifer Pease
 - RTU is the admit type for returning students (students who have been out for 2 consecutive semesters); ICU is the admit type for intercampus transfer students. Information on these groups is now available in the Point-in-Cycle Report. http://imir.iupui.edu/picx/reports/1/20/default.aspx
 - General Studies degree students are handled directly by General Studies and are not included in the PIC reports.
 - Summer 2007 is the beginning for establishing a baseline for comparative information.
 - o It is very helpful to have units contact students who have indicated that they want to return to IUPUI.
 - Admissions and University College are using an Accelerated Improvement Process to review the procedures that are being used so that the process can work as smoothly as possible.
- New email message to recently registered students—Mary Beth Myers
 - A concern was generated from the Bursar Appeal Committee. A number of the students who submit appeals owe IUPUI because they thought that lack of payment of tuition and/or not attending classes would result in their withdrawal from the classes without financial penalty.
 - A message will be send to recently registered students stating that they must take an action if they want to withdraw from classes and the consequences if they do not.
