MILITARY SCIENCE DEPARTMENT

A Department of Military Science was established at IUPUI by the I.U. Board of Trustees at a meeting May 1 in Bloomington. Lt. Col. Henry E. Rosser was named chairman of the new department and director of the ROTC program.

Rosser is a U.S. Army Infantry officer and has been on active duty for 17 years with two tours in Germany and two in the Far East. He has served in Vietnam and is currently assigned with the U.S. Army's 2nd Infantry Division in Korea. He also will have the academic rank of professor of military science at IUPUI.

In other action, Gerald L. Bepko, professor and associate dean of law, will become acting dean of the School of Law-Indianapolis, and Patricia A. Boaz was appointed assistant dean of the Purdue School of Science at IUPUI, both effective July 1. Also in the School of Science, Joseph Kuczkowski, professor of mathematical sciences, was named acting chairman of that department effective June 1.

HONORS AND ACCOLADES

<u>Dr. Alec Lui</u>, fellow in Gastroenterology, has been named the first recipient of the Bowman Research Prize for his studies on vitamin B-6. The \$400 prize was presented by the Department of Biochemistry of the I.U. School of Medicine in honor of Dr. Donald E. Bowman, who was the first chairman of the present department. Dr. Lui received the M.D. degree from the Medical College of Wisconsin in 1977, after which he came to the I.U. Hospitals. The reserach for which he was recognized was carried out in collaboration with Dr. Larry Lumeng and Dr. Ting Kai Li, professors of medicine and biochemistry.

Professors Robert Kirch and Patrick McGreever were part of a panel on "State and Local Politics and Processes" at the recent annual meeting of the Indiana Political Science Association. <u>Professor Richard Fredland</u> made a presentation as part of the panel on "Teaching Political Science," and <u>Professor Victor Wallis</u> was a discussant on the panel on "The American Right."
