





As a Wayne Township school principal, Nicole Law considers it her job to help her Garden City Elementary students confront challenges and pursue their dreams — and that's a subject Nicole knows quite a bit about.

Throughout her life, the former IUPUI student and IU School of Education graduate has battled Sickle Cell Anemia, a painful genetic disease. But Nicole's determination and dedication in battling the disease — her personal "no-excuse" credo — has helped her build an atmosphere of achievement for Garden City students, many of whom must overcome the challenges of a life of poverty. The impact of her work and that of her staff recently earned Nicole the prestigious 2008 Milken National Educator Award nicknamed the "Oscars of Teaching" — making her one of an elite group of educators that are helping shape the academic future of America.



(Undergraduate, Graduate, & Professional)



IUPUI Full-Time Undergraduate Enrollment













IUPUI First-Professional Degrees Conferred


Number of First-Professional Degrees Conferred




IUPUI Minority Degrees Conferred



Master planners map vision for IUPUI's next decade



Six easels scribbled with hopes and goals for **IUPUI** stood out April 3 in the Campus Center food court as David King and his Master Planners searched for any input from students, faculty and staff on what would better the campus and surrounding city in the near future.

Michael A. McRobbie, Indiana University president, laid out a vision last fall to create a Master Plan for both the Bloomington and Indianapolis campuses and initiated a search for who would best be able to make transformations to the schools.

After interviewing more than 40 design groups, McRobbie discovered the **JJR**, also known as the **Smith** Group, and hired nationally renowned chairman David King to lead IUPUl's own architectural extreme makeover. But unlike the television show, there will be no time for a trip to Disneyland. King says the work starts right now.
