### Soviets will not invade

A high ranking official of the Polish government, speaking at the Student Union last praised the new leadership in his country and said the Soviet Union will not invade Poland.

Witold Kiesun addressed a group sponsored by the Office of the International Programs and Services World Forum Series. Keizum, a member of the Liberal Democratic Party, explained that several members of the government ranks are not party members.

A former classmate of Pope John Paul II, Keizum is in the states as a visiting professor at Temple University. He is Chairman of the Department of Public Administration in the Institute of Management Organization for the Council of Ministers, an attorney, author and university professor. Kiezun said Solidarity, the

Kiezun said Solidarity, the militant labor movement, has been successful and praised its leader Lech Waless for being an honest man. He explained that Solidarity is not against accialism, but against the rampant corruption in the centralized government.

centralized government.

"Poland," said Kiesun "is
moving away from
totalitarianism and toward a
just and efficient society."

"There is a move toward
democratization," Kiesum said,
"but Poland will remain a
socialist country."

"The new white collar worker is under the age of 25 and is better educated than his parents. "The open door to the west" has influenced the young polish workers a great deal and there is much opportunistic thinking. The easiest way to obtain goods is the black market," explained Kiesun. "The structure of government and development of resources present a complex dicotomy in

While they produce much of the world's steel, through the highest technological means—Poland depends on foreign grain. The infrastructure of the country is weak, and there is drastic contrast between rich and poor. Kiesun is optimistic about the new leadership of Deputy Prime Minister Mieczyslaw Rakowsky, head of labor affairs, whom he says is highly respected for his integrity.

His appointment is a sign that the corruption of the centralized government—who promised equal sharing of the wealth but lived extravagantly—is a thing of the past.

Keixun said the Soviet Union will not invade Poland and their differences can be negotiated. "Historically, Russia has only attacked weak, under-developed nations. If they should come into Poland the war would be short—three or four days—and bloody. It would be followed by a permanent guerilla war." he stated.





### Assistance Available

by JoAnn Shanks IUPUI students may now ek free legal assistance through the Law School and Dr. Mannan, Dean of Student ervices. Staffed by Dr. Frandsen and senior year law students, the Legal Referral System will be available on Fridays from 1:30 p.m. to 5:30 p.m. in Room 202 of the Law School and will, according to Frandsen, either confirm the existence of a legal problem or tell the student it's not worth pursuing, and why. The organization, however does not handle litigation, but rather refers students to proper legal counsel. Those students needing an attorney's services but unable to afford it may contact the Legal Services Organization or the Legal Aid Society of Indianapolis. The Indianapolis Bar Association also provides referral services.

Initiated in the Student Assembly during December Legal Referral System will hear landlord-tenant disputes, automobile accidents, and other problems normal to student's daily living. Because many students sign contracts, Dr. Mannan encourages students to seek advice before signing contracts. If enough students utilize the referral system, at the end of this semester some other alternatives might be explored for the future. 



The senior all-star, a native of Plainfield, is the most active athlete in the school's history, earning letters in archery, badminton, rowing, bob-sled, baseball, basketball, cycling, curling, chess, cross-country, croquet, crew, darts, diving, decathlon, equestrian arts, epee, football, fencing, figure skating, foosball, fishing, golf, gymnastics, ice hockey, jogging, jai alai, karate, kickball, luge, lacrosse, marathoning, mountain climbing, nerfball, olympic torch carrying, ping pong, pentathlon, polo, quartermidget racing, racquetball, riflery, soccer, sailing, speed skating, skiing, swimming, softball, tennis, track and field, underwater sex, volleyball, wrestling, x-tra pointing, yachting, and zig-zag zippering.

Around IUPUI, Nellum is known as "the Flash," but it is not clear whether he got this nickname for his speed on the basepaths or for his recent arrest outside Ball Residence Hall.

# Officer Dork spills dope

The Eromagas recognizes its responsibility to bring the university administration and students closer together. This time the Gas interviews Dave Dork of the Campus Cops Dept. Officer Dork has been with the department for four years and was picked for this interview by Campus Cops Chief N.S. Ertion. Chief Ertion picked Officer Dork because he represented the average campus cop. Roving reporter Bill Williams caught up with Officer Dork just after his duty shift.

Gas: Hello, Officer Dork. Or can I call you Dave?

DD: Call me Officer Dork or Your Excellency, or Extremely High Omnipotent Dork!

Gas: Okay! Well Officer Dork, what is your favorite duty assignment?

No Children Under Two

In 1980, Tech lost the title to Kewanna High after Land fouled out. But this past spring, the "Land of the titans" cameback to lead his undefeated squad to the 1981 state championship.

"He is a gigantic talent – what the pros call a 'franchise maker," raves elated IUPUI coach K.J. Underhanded, who is already predicting future NAIA titles. His resence on the team will encourage other all-stars to come to IUPUI, and he will really draw the crowds in to our games. Everywhere he goes, people flock in droves to see him

Last season the 6'11" (Lem's side) and 6'10%" (Garl's side) 290 lb. Land scored an average of 74.6 ppg on a variety of one-two-three-and four-handed shots. Although he usually works underneath, where he has been known to pass the ball over his head to his other side, he is an excellent perimeter shooter as well. He is almost sure-fire on offense therefore connecting on over 82 percent of his attempts from the field. Land also converted on 84 percent of his

tries at the free throw line. He went to the charity stripe a record-shattering number of times last year. "He's fouled all the time," says Underhanded. "Because even if Garl has the ball, Lem can be fouled. And if Garl was in the act of shooting, it would still be a two-shot foul."

The versatile, and surprisingly mobile, Land also hauled down nearly 38 rebounds a game in his senior year. "He's pretty unbeatable on the offensive board, because there's twice as many hands in there fighting for tip-ins," explains his high school mentor, Rick "Rooting" Violations, coach of Indianapolis Technical Foul. "And if one of his sides misses a layup, the other side is right there to tap it in."

His off-ball movements are stunning. He sets a mean screen, and opposing players claim that Land "picks like a Kenworth." With all his own offensive prowess, he is still unselfish. He will draw the defense, then feed the ball in unbelieveable ways to open teammates.

Defensively, Land has been labeled a "monster." "you

simply can't get the ball inbounds against him, you can't see with all those arms waving at you," an ex-opponent wails. "He ties you up in knots," cries another," and when he does, well, you just don't know what frustration is until you've been in a jump ball situation that freer, Lem and Garl Land."

"When he positions himself underneath the defensive board, he takes up the whole lane," fumes a coach at an Indianapolis high school. "With that kind of body to block out, he grabs those rebounds every time."

those rebounds every time."
Although opponents like thes have been screaming "unfair" for the past several years, the humble Land is more than a bit embarassed over all the hoopla that surrounds him. He especially resents the media calling him the "perfect" or "ultimate" player. "I'm not perfect," Land insists. "I make my share of turnovers. I really have to be careful when I inbound the ball so one of my feet doesn't step on the line."

"We think we slow down a fast break a little too much," both chime in, "and we have to work on co-ordinating our dribbling. We don't do all that bad at bring the ball up court for as big as we are, but we think we can do better."


According to one coach, whose team fell to Land in the tournament the Lem-Garl

combination is practically impossible to defend against. Said the diagruntled coach, "You just can't defend him manto-man – you don't have enough men on your own team to do that. And sooner or later, he eats up a zone, even a sagging boxon-one won't work. If you try to concentrate solely on him, his teammates will be open at all times and that can rip you apart

Land has had a foul problem, particularly in his junior prep campaign. But he did improve his senior year. After his foul plauged junior year, his coach petitioned the IHSAA to allow Lem and Garl 8 fouls before disqualification. The IHSAA denied the request, but IUPUI coach Underhanded reveals that the National Intercollegiate Athletic Association (NAIA) may permit Land to have the 8 fouls due to "the peculiar circumstances."

Off-court, Land is a model student-leader – "two heads are better than one," quips Garl. He (they) have not yet decided on a major, but is (are) leaning toward a career in genetic research

When queried about a future in professional basketball, Land just smiled. "I've been approached to turn pro right now, but I intend to stay all four years at IUPUI.






