CANCER SPECIALISTS CARE TO SHARE

A year ago Indiana oncologists, physicians who specialize in caring for cancer patients, established the Hoosier Oncology Group so that they might promote clinical trials in cancer care and to share information about new research and treatments in the field. The group was scheduled to meet at Methodist Hospital on Jan. 19 to accept two donations and to hear our Dr. Jan Jansen discuss bone marrow transplantation. He is director of our new bone marrow transplant center--the first in the state.

HOG (sorry, but that is the acronym) members also accepted a \$2,000 check from Phi Beta Psi sorority, a national group that raises funds for cancer research, and another \$1,000 from Winona Foundation Cancer Fund. Also on the agenda was Dr. Roger Herzig, director of bone marrow transplantation at Cleveland Clinic.-TW

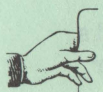
SENATE HEARINGS POSTPONE VISIT FROM NEH CHAIRMAN

STUDY OFFERS CHANCE TO KICK THE HABIT

People who wear dentures and want to quit smoking can be part of a study by the Oral Health Research Institute of the IU School of Dentistry. The study involves the use of a nicotine-containing chewing gum, developed to help people break the habit. Purpose of the study is to determine if denture wearers can use the gum. Needed are 200 adult volunteers, age 18 or over, who smoke at least 20 cigarettes per day and who have a sincere desire to quit smoking. Must wear at least an upper denture. Study will require five-month period which includes five appointments of 45-60 minutes. Volunteers will also be required to attend a one-day, stop-smoking clinic. PROF. JEGEN'S TAX TIPS: PROFESSIONAL DEDUCTIONS

In preparing your 1984 income tax returns, remember you can deduct items listed below. Items 1-4 should be deducted whether you itemize your deductions or take the "zero bracket" amount. Items 5-13 generally should be deducted only if you itemize. Items 14-16 are credits (direct reductions) against the applicable tax.

1. Cost of travel to professional conventions and meetings, including meals, lodging and transportation.
2. Automobile expenses. Use either actual cost or flat amount of 20.5 cents per mile for the first 15,000 miles and 11 cents per mile thereafter (plus parking) to and around: All Indianapolis-area campuses, state-wide campuses, student and faculty meetings, professional meetings, the State House, various hospitals, clinics and libraries. Remember to keep a contemporaneous record of your business use of your vehicles. Further, there are other strict tests which must be met in order for you to deduct any vehicle transportation expenses.
3. Moving expenses to come to Indianapolis.
4. An IRA (or SIRA) plan contribution. Remember that no income tax deduction will be allowed for an IRA contribution which is made after the due date (April 15 for most of you) of the income tax return on which the deduction is to be taken. Also, remember that IU and Purdue will withhold some of your salary and keep the withheld amount in a retirement fund for you, and you will not be taxed for income tax purposes on the amount until you withdraw the amount from the fund--presumably at your retirement.
5. Cost of professional books (some of the books might have to be capitalized and depreciated), magazines, newspapers, journals, etc.
6. Professional association dues.
7. Cost of supplies, including pens, pencils, paper, stationery, postage, etc.
8. Office in home expenses. For example, a portion of depreciation of your house and tangible personal property, fuel, water, electricity, insurance, taxes, interest and telephone. However, there are several significant limitations on taking these deductions.
9. Teacher's liability insurance premiums. You can add this protection on your homeowner's policy for about 50 cents a year.
10. Cost of research--additional secretarial assistance, and gifts or presents (up to \$25 per donee) for your secretary and to members of the maintenance staff.
11. Cost of cap and gown for commencements and dedications.
12. Depreciation on tangible personal property in your school office, for example, rugs, lamps, pictures, frames, tape recorders, computers, word processors, chairs, briefcases and other accessories. Remember that even if you must capitalize some of your tangible personal property, you may elect to "expense" (that is, to take an immediate income tax deduction for) an amount of your business tangible personal property purchases, during the year up to \$5,000.
13. Tuition, books and supplies for courses which you take and books and supplies for courses which you teach.
14. Investment credit for purchases of tangible personal property which is used in your office.
15. Credit for political contributions.
16. Credit (on your Indiana income tax return) for charitable contributions which you make to certain Indiana educational institutions or to certain foundations, including IU.

And, for your assistance, an informative free booklet, "Your Income Tax," is published by the federal government and is available from the IRS. Also, an excellent book is: 1985 Tax Guide for College Teachers and Other College Personnel, which can be purchased from Academic Information Service, Inc., PO Box 4008, Washington, D.C. 20015.

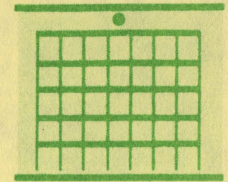
