HYPERTENSION EXPERTS TO HIGHLIGHT MEDICAL PROGRAM

Hypertension will be the subject of a symposium featuring <u>four national</u> <u>authorities</u> that will highlight the 11th Annual Midwest Student Medical Research Forum March 26-28 by the I.U. medical students.

Hoosier physicians and others interested in current approaches in the pathophysiology and treatment of hypertension are being invited to attend the symposium which will be held from 1 p.m. to 5 p.m. March 27 in the auditorium of the School of Nursing.

Featured speakers will be <u>Dr. John C. McGiff</u>, chairman of pharmacology, New York Medical College; <u>Dr. Tadashi Inagami</u>, director of the Specialized Center of Research in Hypertension at Vanderbilt University; <u>Dr. Myron H. Weinberger</u>, director of the Specialized Center of Research in Hypertension at the I.U. School of Medicine, and <u>Dr. Norman M. Kaplan</u>, professor of internal medicine at the University of Texas Health Science Center.

The Forum also will feature <u>more than 50 research papers</u> in a dozen fields presented by medical and graduate students from more than 20 medical schools throughout the Midwest. Student research papers will be presented the morning of March 27 and all day March 28.

"The Excitement of Clinical Investigation" will be the subject of an address by Dean Steven C. Beering at a banquet for the participants March 27.

Co-directors of the 1980 Forum are Gregory Sides and Mervin Yoder, both medical school seniors. Other members of the local committee are Paul Houston, David Fowler, David Mandelbaum and Eileen Olinger.

First held at the University of Iowa in 1969, the Midwest Student Medical Research Forum became affiliated with the Midwest Section of the American Federation of Clinical Research in 1970. Since then the Midwest Forum has met every year at a Midwest medical school and has continued to grow in both the number of participants and the caliber of research presented. Abstracts are published each year in Clinical Research, the Federation journal. Gary Fitzgerald, senior I.U. medical student, is this year's president of the Forum's planning committee.
