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

Did You Know? Policies in Brief...

Paid Leave for Academic Appointees: The University has policies in place to help provide work-life balance for full-time for academic appointees (4 or 5 day appointments). One of these policies, Paid Family Leave for Academic Appointees, helps prevent financial hardship during a time of family need. This policy is separate from the academic Sick Leave policy which provides protection from financial hardship for the personal illness of a full-time faculty member (see the November 2013 issue for details.). Paid Family Leave for Academic Appointees provides up to 12 weeks of pay (reduced in some instances) for faculty to provide support for a family member

who is ill. An eligible family member is a spouse, domestic partner, parent, dependent child or a dependent child of the appointee's spouse or domestic partner.

Faculty who are in a care provider situation should contact their department and the Office of Faculty Affairs to learn more about Paid Family Leave to evaluate the need and determine eligibility. Examples of situations that can be considered for Paid Family Leave are eldercare for parents and the birth or adoption of a child.

GIS Implementation is Near

The long awaited implementation of GIS for the management of credentials starts on Monday, March 3 for all faculty (full-time, adjunct,

volunteers). As a faculty member, you are designated as a User in GIS. You will be expected to log-in to GIS starting March 3 to verify your demographic information and check for Tasks. One of the first Tasks assigned to most faculty will be to update your dental or hygiene license in GIS. There will be a Task assigned to you for this purpose and the Task will include instructions on what needs to be done. Training on GIS will be available through webinars, an on-line video, a quick start sheet and other methods. Webinars are scheduled in DS 114 at the following times:

Dr. Chambers is professor of dental education and former associate dean for academic affairs and scholarship at the University of the Pacific, Arthur A. Dugoni School of Dentistry in San Francisco.
