FOCUS: VIETNAM

The <u>Third Annual IUPUI International Film Series</u> focuses on Vietnam this year. Sponsored by the Office of International Programs, the series begins September 25 and continues for <u>five consecutive Tuesdays</u> through October 30.

The first film in the series will be the 1974 winner of the Academy Award for Best Documentary Feature, "<u>Hearts and Minds</u>," directed by Peter Davis. This highly controversial documentary is a complex exploration into the American psyche, as well as a study of politics, ideals and the nature of the war.

On October 2, Emile de Antonio's documentary <u>"In the Year of the Pig"</u> will be shown. The film is an assembly of news footage, focusing on the issues of the Vietnam War.

The 1967 documentary <u>"Far from Vietnam"</u> studies the issues of conflict between revolutionary societies and Western powers and the role of the intellectual in times of political crisis. Produced by a group of collaborating filmmakers including Jean-Luc Godard and Alain Resnais, it will be shown October 9.

Joris Ivens' documentary "17th Parallel" will be shown October 16. Filmed in 1965, "17th Parellel" (referring to the geographic dividing line between North and South Vietnam established by the 1954 Geneva Accords) records the resistance of the Vietnamese people during a critical period in their history.

"The Anderson Platoon," produced and directed by former Life magazine correspondent, Pierre Schoendorffer, will be shown October 23. Schoendorffer comments in the introduction of this film that he "discovered America" while making the film, "the America between the cliches."

The final film of the series, "Inside North Vietnam" produced by Felix Greene, will be shown October 30. Nominated by the British Film Academy as one of the four best documentaries produced in 1968, "Inside North Vietnam" was made by Greene while a special correspondent in North Vietnam for The San Francisco Chronicle and under a special contract with CBS Television News.

The series is <u>free</u> and open to the public; the films will be shown at 7 p.m. in Lecture Hall 101. Audience <u>discussions</u> will follow each film. Discussants will be David Mannweiler, columnist and film reviewer for The Indianapolis News, and Joseph C. Farah, assistant director, Office of International Programs, film reviewer for Indiana Arts Insight and host of WIAN's weekly radio program "Focus on Film."

BUSING, IUPUI-STYLE

Four different campus bus services are now plying their various routes around town and countryside. For a quick synopsis of each of these services, the Green Sheet offers this friendly round-up:

THE SHUTTLE OF IUPUI

Shuttle starts north from Cavanaugh Hall at 7:55 a.m. and travels north to Marott Building, Herron and Krannert Science Building.

Northbound service departs Cavanaugh at five minutes before the hour until 3:55 p.m. Shuttle starts south from Krannert at 7:25 a.m. and at 25 minutes after the hour until 4:25 p.m. Cost is 25¢ per trip (one way). For information, call Ext. 4511.

LIBRARY BUS TO BLOOMINGTON & BACK

Starting September 15, a free shuttle bus service will commute between IUPUI and the I.U. Library in Bloomington.
